Friday June the 20

First part of this day light & variable winds
with the thick fog at 9 o'clock became away
went up to the mast heads to look out
saw plenty of Porpoises but cant look up
Whales middle part saw hump & back & saw
after 1 it was a Knight Whale the Labboard
started but did not fasten chased until 4 o'clock
got aboard 12 4 P.M. plenty of Whales in sight
But not the right stripe sunset took in
Sail light winds from W.S.W. latter
part the same so ends the day 2 sails in sight

Saturday June 21 the

First part of this day Strong Winds from
the W.N.W. heading S.W. at sunrise
thick fog but cleared off cloudy weather
2 sails in sight at 10 A.M. spoke the
Ship Onorio & Sag harbor 1 month
out 7 Whales at 3 P.M. spoke the
Ship Baltic of fair harbor 18 months out
12 or 14 hundred Whales that 1 Boat started
of the S. B. antwort was killed middle part
the same 3 sails in sight latter part
Strong Winds some rain so ends the day

Sunday June 22 the D 1843

First part of this day calm till 10 A.M.
at 10 A.M. toward after a sulphur Boats without
saw toward again at 2 after 12
Whales the 4 Boats the Whales got gale
& the Starboard boat come the other boats
saw more some ways off 1 Boat to 10
them the Waite Boat struck the same while
the Bow Boat struck the same while
the Labboard Boat killed him took
him in tow about sunset 10 miles from
the ship & some far to get half way to
the ship the Boat was at West end

hard so ends the day

Tuesday June 24 the

this day commenced with strong Winds & fog
at 9 A.M. commenced boiling & at 3 P.M.
could down again it blowing a gale of wind
from the W.S.W. broke the mainmast
& lost the main topmast several
Whales in sight middle part the same
& latter part some rain so ends the day

Wednesday June 25 the

this day blowing a gale of Wind from
the S.W. heading W by S middle part
hoisted up the Boats on the upper cranes
latter part the same so ends the day

Thursday June 26

this day gale like called the Whales a gale
ready for trying at 6 A.M. commenced
thick fog the wind from the W.S.W.
heading S by S hole topmasts middle part
the same latter part the same Watch employed
in boiling out so ends the day
