

Remarks On Board of

Tuesday July 22nd the
this day commenced with strong winds
from the N.W. came South with
thick fog at 8 A.M. cleared up some
sail in light middle part the same
spoke the ship William took of Sag Harbor
22 months out Nov 22. at 3 P.M. went
a light whale without success later part foggy
so ends the day much the same

Wednesday July 23rd the
first part of strong winds from the N.W.
heading S.E. at 12 M. saw and 30 m. up
back toward 4 boats to strike some hump
that killed the whale they took him over
and 16 trying to scoop him struck 1 killer
from 1000 so ends the day

Thursday July 24th the
first part of this day strong winds from
the N.W. saw 1 whale but all got
poor on their backs spoke the ship
because of low water 22 months out
23 commenced middle part foggy
later part clear N.W. winds the day

Friday July 25th the
this day commenced with fog. Wind from
N.W. laying with the main topmast
masts courses hauled up middle part same
22 later part strong winds & rain
so ends the day

Saturday July 26th the
this day strong winds from the N.W. heading
E by N. 3 sails in sight spoke the ship Clamuel
Sag Harbor also the ship Penamar of Stonington
& 1 whale saw hump backs middle part the same
later part clear E by S winds

Sunday July 27th the P.D. 1845
first part of this day commenced with strong
winds from the N.W. came E by N.
middle part the same & later foggy
the ice sail & left the hand so ends the
day of 24 hours

Monday July 28th the P.D.
first part of this day commenced with light winds
from the N.W. at 1 A.M. the fog cleared off & at
one surprise the land under the ice called all hands
to make sail got sail and the land bore N.E. & E
& at 8 toward after eight whales without success
at 1 the land bore N. 1st 5 miles the small being
the ship on the land took the ship in tow & toward
until 2.30 came a boat these stores a called
bleaching island & coopers island from the N.W.
course N.W. later part rainy so ends the day

Tuesday July 29th the
first part of this day light winds from the
N. bore at 2 P.M. 3 whales from the N.W.
3 P.M. took in topgallant sails thick fog & rain
at 7 double reefed topgallant sails & later part
blewing hard land in sight so ends the day

Wednesday July 30th the P.D. 1845
first part of this day fine breeze from N.W. & V
land in sight bore N.E. with heavy swell on
at 5 P.M. saw hump backs 2 sails in sight the
same at 5 a.m. saw a whale had been
killed. Bore for him while sailing
for him saw eight whales
bore a 3 boats without success
took the third whale about 10 &
cut him in 2 sails in sight
so ends the day
