Friday Nov 14th

First part of this day begins with strong winds from the N.E. course S.S.E. under hole topsails the watch employed in doing down middle part the same & latter part double reefed & mizen topsail so ends the day
Lat 16.50 N

Saturday Nov 15th D

First part of this day begins with strong winds from the N.E. course S.S.E. watch employed in the Boon business middle part the same & latter part heavy squalls of wind & rain so ends the day much the same
Lat 14.33 N Long 158.25 E

Sunday Nov 16th D

First part of this day strong winds from N.E. course S.S.E. watch employed in ships duty middle part the same & latter part set main topgallant sail & flying Jib so ends the day
Lat 12.11 N

Monday November 17th

First part of this day begins with strong winds from N.E. course S.S.E. watch employed in furling down topgallant battens parted middle part wind laid away set in heavy rain & heavy squalls of wind latter part ends the same under double reefed topsails so ends the day of much the same

Tuesday Nov 18th D 1845

First part of this day begins with variable winds with rain & thunder made hole topsails saw some watch employed in rope making middle part the same & latter part winds from the south so ends the day

First part of this day begins with strong winds from the N.E. course S.S.E. with all possible sail set watch employed in ships duty furling mizen & middle part the same & latter part plenty of rain so ends the day Lat 8 N Long 157.25 E

Thursday Nov 20th D 1845

This day begins with calm & rain middle part the same strong light winds from south 2 men at each boat baling water out it rained so fast latter part the same so ends the day

Friday Nov 21st D 1845

First part of this day begins with light winds & calms watch employed in rope making saw porpoises middle part the same & latter part rainy so ends the day

Saturday Nov 22nd

First part of this day begins with light winds from the N.E. course S by E watch employed in furling mizen & middle part the same & latter part squalls of rain so ends the day Lat 5.45 N

Sunday Nov 23rd

First part of this day begins with light winds & calms saw grampuses middle part the same & latter part all hands in swimming lowered the ship & whistles in the water a sporting a large shark came to eat some of us but it so happened he did not the mate put a iron through him so ends the day
