

Remarks On Board The

Wednesday, Dec 24th

This day begins with light winds with heavy showers of rain all hands employed in storing down saw some black fish but not lower for them middle parts the same & latter parts clear weather so ends the day jamming with the Harriet

Thursday, Dec 25th Christmas Day

This commences with light winds from the N.E. course N.W. capt King went on board of the Harriet to take dinner heads a Pig, middle parts the same & latter parts cloudy so ends the day of 24 hours Lat 41.20 South

Friday, Dec 26th 1845

This day commences with light & variable winds course N.W. watch employed in ships duty middle parts the same lower parts the same after the masts but & latter parts the same so ends this day much the same Lat 3.18 South Long 1.70 E or

Saturday, Dec 27th

This day commences with strong winds & squalls watch employed in braking out for molasses & capt Duffer come jamming & got a lung, Boon Sherke struck him with iron killed several of the other kind middle parts dead calm & latter parts light winds so ends the day

Sunday, Dec 28th 1845

This day commences with light winds & calms with showers of rain watch employed in drying the sails middle parts the same & latter parts moderate winds so ends the day of 24 hours

Monday, Dec 29th

This day begins with light winds & calms watch employed in ships duty middle parts the same & latter parts lower parts after black fish did not get any so ends the day

Tuesday, Dec 30th 1845

This day commences with light & variable winds watch employed in mending sails middle parts the same latter parts plenty of porpoises so ends the day

Wednesday, Dec 31st 1845

This day commences with light winds from the E.S.E. course West watch employed in ships duty middle parts the same & latter parts rain so ends the day

Thursday, January the 1st 1846 New Years Day

This day commences with moderate winds & squalls spoke the ship charriot of wren R.I. 18 months out 21 hundred the capt come aboard & took dinner out fresh pig middle parts the same & latter parts calms so ends the day of 24 hours Lat 3.20 S Long 1.72

Friday, Jan 2nd 1846

This day commences with light winds watch employed in ships duty, loozing around Decker making nothing to do nothing so ends the day of 24 hours
