

Monday March 23rd 1854
Got water & stowed it all day. 125 bbls
unrigged the mastingale to have a new
one made &c In Talcahuano

Tuesday March 24th
Had a northwester first part of the better
part day latter part pleasant all hands
getting water & stowing it got in all
180 bbls -

Wednesday March 25th
All day moderate & pleasant all hands
employed in stowing water washing
ship &c &c 4 ships went to sea today
and one arrived at

Talcahuano

Thursday March 26th
One watch ashore got off the last
water making in all 378 bbls all stowed

Friday March 27th
Starboard came on board larboard went
sold & delivered to bbls Port 67 galls Molasses
received 100 half sacks flour

Saturday March 28th
Starboard watch ashore Cooper & George
Westholm absented themselves from the
larboard watch at

Sunday March 29th 1854
Starboard watch returned except Isaac
Blunt (boatsteerer) larboard watch went
Talcahuano

Monday March 30th
Strong breeze from S.S.W. these men run from
larboard watch. Henry Richards, Boyant Pa-
rns & David Boyer painted ship outside
with paint oil painted larboard boat ins-
ide rigged a new spritsail yard & put it
out &c &c

Tuesday March 31st
Starboard watch returned except John
Key larboard watch returned took off
48 bbls Potatoes rigged a new mastingale
fitted & set up guys & stays &c &c

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Wednesday April 1st
Strong breeze from S.E. to S.W. painted
all the boats except bow all hands
on board of the original crew

Talcahuano

Thursday April 2nd
All day strong southerly wind, all hands
on board sent the mainsail down repaired
it and bent it. Cooper came on board
one shipped her Talcahuano

Friday April 3rd
Calm all day 4th Mate Mr Francis & three
men came on board dropped second anchor
at sunset a northwester coming on
