Fresh breeze & pleasant steering N by N
spoke & jammed with ship Phillip Delnoye of
Fair Haven 18 mo^d out 300 Sp. saw two schools
of B. fish

Sunday May 3^d
Laying off and on at Payta Capt Wood
went on shore A.M. I & Mr. boat returned
stood out to come in on Tuesday
got letters from Frank & from my wife
Payta

Monday May 4th
Got a humpback & sunk another off Payta
Head cut him in leeward & cut up blubber put
it into casks off Payta Head

Tuesday May 5th
Went in to Payta boiling for Capt Wood &
came out without him to go in tomorrow
Peru laying off son at Payta

Wednesday May 6th
Went in and got Capt Wood and
stood out in Co with Peru

Payta

Thursday May 7th
Running down along shore for Tombez under
all sail

Lat 3.45 S

Friday May 8th
Anchored at Tombez Bark William
Lee of Newport 8 mo^d out 400 Sp. & Sea Queen
of Westport 20 mo^d out 950 Sp. laying here

Saturday May 9th 1854
Fine weather repaired fly jib received
5^{lb} Cord wood 44 lb. paper delivered
Tombez

Sunday May 10th
Rec 3 Cord wood & 9 lbs sweet-pota
toz 13 - probly delivered two lbs Irish

Monday May 11th
Received of our vessel four thousand oranges
some lying & 4 struck adrift in a strong
breeze ran two lines to windward and lay until
taken twice and got under with

Tuesday May 12th
In sight of vessel at anchor saw an en-
glish brig bound to S. Sea Queen eastern
off

Wednesday May 13th
Overcast & strong breeze took in some of the
light sail saw blackfish & humpbacks &
course W N W & W Lat 1.39 S

Thursday May 14th
Saw nothing pleasant weather course
W N W & N by W carrying all sail
Lat 0.43 S Long 85.27 W

Friday May 15th
Course N by W spoke Bark Beris Capt Pierce
of N. Belford 9 mo^d out 115 Sp. Capt P
came on board sturica N by N
Lat 0.51 N
