Monday June 1st 1854
 A fine day see nothing light winds
 from S. E. course W. N. W. & by N under
 all sail Lat 3.03. N

Tuesday June 2nd
 Fine weather flowered for blackfish with-
 out success. boiled out the fish we caught.
 Sunday wind S. S. E. course W. under all
 sail Lat 3.14. N

Wednesday June 3rd
 Fine weather & pleasant breeze from S. by E
 course W. saw porpoise & a finback
 Lat 3.25. N Long 97.55. W

Thursday June 4th
 Fine weather see nothing to remark
 cooped our humpback oil and put it
 between decks. S. by E course W. by S.
 Lat 4.07

Friday 5th June 1854
 Strong S. by E. wind course W. by S under
 all sail saw nothing but porpoise

Lat 4.09. N Long 102.45. W

Saturday June 6th
 Fresh breeze land overcast saw
 porpoise Lat 4.02. N

Sunday June 7th
 Raining calm weather course N. by W
 under all sail air from S. E. & E.

Observation

Monday June 8th
 Raining all day caught water air from
 S. course N. W. see nothing

Tuesday June 9th
 Raining as usual see nothing caught
 some rain water to drink

Lat 4.07. N Long 107.22. W

Wednesday June 10th
 Calm & very hot at 3 P. M. a light air
 from S. E. course N. by W under all sail

Lat 4.25. N Long 107.51. W

Thursday June 11th
 Light air from W. headed by the
 wind to N. by W under all sail
 see nothing Lat 8.17. N Long 107.59. W

Friday June 12th
 Raining weather all day light breeze from
 all points of the compass
 Lat 8.41. N Long
