 Struck a grampus. To bore boat took
 his line very quick lost the run of
 him twice but during the day got up
 to him two or three times lanced him
 a number of times but he did not spout
 any blood chased him as long as we
 could see any thing and gave it up
 as a bad job. Took a line three iron
 two grapples 20 fathoms of another line
 and one bent lance.

 Calm all day see nothing

 Calm & foggy see nothing

Saturday July 11th
 Fine NW wind & course S E by E and
 all sail lowered all the boats for
 blackfish and got one to starboard boat

 Strong wind all W NW course E S E
 & E by S. man all drawing sail see
 nothing

Lat 23.23 N Long 111.20 W

Monday July 13th
 Went in to Capt St Lucas at 6 P M Capt
 Wood went on shore sent the boat off to lay
 off for mackerel part squally wind from NE
 & took in light sails & reefed down it
 blowing strong land in sight

Cape St Lucas

Tuesday July 14th 1854
 Had a gale took in sail to close reefed
 main topsail it moderated again and
 P M had light sails set over reefed
 topsails wind E. beating up to Cape St
 Lucas

Wednesday July 15th
 Fine weather wind E S E gal
 up to Cape & at 8 P M Capt Wood
 came on board in the blow yesterday
 a Brigg went ashore in the bay from
 her anchor. got a few Onions & S. Potatoes
 & just Buff. 50 lb of powdered onions 8.75 per
 hundred weight potatoes dear & scarce

Thursday July 16th
 Got out of sight of Capt St Lucas
 light wind from W course S E. man all
 sail

Friday July 17th
 Fine weather wind W course S E
 see nothing

Lat 20.59 N

Saturday July 18th
 Fine weather wind W NW course
 S E by E man all drawing sail

Lat 19.14 N Long 106.55 W

Sunday July 19th
 Rainy all day A M wind NW P M
 S S E see nothing took in sail to drench
 reefed topsails & courses & set sail
 again
