ESE see nothing washed ship outside

Thursday July 23^d
Calm see nothing breasted paint outside
had a thunder squall with a plenty of light-
ning last night no wind

Friday July 24th
Calm & light air, & pleasant and very
hot see nothing painted stateroom black
the iron work anchors & so

Saturday July 25th
Light air, & calm, course ESE wind vary-
ing from NNE to W carrying all sail
cleaned & painted cabin &

Sunday July 26th
Calm all day Spoke Bark Sophronia of
Boston 22 days from Callao bound to May-
atlan got late papers saw a number
of grampuss.

Monday July 27th 1857
Squally all day wind from all quarters
our course is S by E carrying all sail
saw grampuss & porpoises

Lat 13.26 N

Tuesday July 28th 1857
Commenced with squally rainy weather
and continued through the day wind from
all quarters our course is S by E under
all sail see nothing No Observations

Wednesday July 29th
Rainy P.M. had a strong squall
of rain & wind took in both sails
A single reefed the topsails A.M.
saw a lone blackfish lowered starboard
boat and caught him

Thursday July 30th
Rainy & pleasant wind from all qua-
rters course S.S.E under all sail lowered
all starboard boat for killing without suc-
cess No Observations

Friday July 31st
Got two sperm whales one to starboard
boat & one to starboard boat on bow
boat struck & drew out then in

W.B. 10.02. N Long

Saturday Aug 1st 1857
Saw whales again & got one to each
boat cut two in and cleared away
heads & cut blubber into horse pieces
weather rainy had a heavy squall of
rain with a plenty of thunder & lightning
