Saturday 27th the Begins with a fine breeze from E to N.E. finished manœuvring saw a bark with all sail set as required steering S.W. the middle and latter part the same so ends this 24 hours
Lat by obs 50-58 S Long by chro 45-12 West

Sunday 28th the Begins with a fine breeze from N. North steered S.W. the middle and latter part the same saw grampuses caught a turtle so ends this day
Lat by obs 52-55 S Long by chro 45-18 West

Monday 29th the Begins with a light breeze and pleasant weather. Steered S.W. wind from North the middle and latter strong breezes steered boats crew saw turtle so ends this 24 hours with fog
Lat by obs 50-58 S Long by chro 46-38 West

Tuesday 30th the Begins with a strong breeze and thick fog at sundown took in sail and luffed by the wind to the South the middle part light breeze at daylight began to blow from S.W. caught a bay
Lat by obs 50-58 S Long by chro 46-38 West

Wednesday 31st the Begins with a strong breeze under double reefed topsails the middle and latter part light winds from W. N.W. heading S.W. saw several turtle bore for one set up main topmast backstays
Lat by obs 51-04 South Long by chro 46-46 West

Thursday 1st the Begins with a strong breeze from N.W. heading S.W. the middle and latter part the same saw a school of fin backs saw plenty porpoises
Lat by obs 52-12 South Long by chro 48-05 West

Friday 2nd the Begins with a fine breeze took a distance in the forenoon sounded out 80 fathoms no bottom took a distance in the forenoon a agreed with the chronometer the middle and latter strong breezes at daylight were ship to the North so ends
Lat by obs 53-04 S Long by chro 48-34 West

Saturday 3rd the Begins with a moderate breeze at 6 A.M. calm the middle and latter part a fine breeze from N.E. on different tacks so ends this 24 hours
Lat by obs 54-25 South Long by chro 48-48 West

Sunday 4th the Begins with a strong breeze and foggy wind from N.W. heading N.W. the middle and latter part rigged and squally wind all around the compass
Lat 56-00 Long 48-30 West

Monday 5th the Begins rigged steered North saw killers and porpoises the middle and latter part a gale of wind from N.W. at 8 A.M. were ship to the South under close reefed main topsail so
Lat by obs 55-50 South Long by chro 47-48 West

Tuesday 6th the Begins with a heavy sea on flying a gale of wind with rain squalls the middle part the same the latter more moderate were ship to the W. N.W. so ends this 24 hours
Lat by obs 55-50 South Long by chro 47-24 West

Wednesday 7th the Begins with a fine breeze from S.W. sent down fore topmasted yard yesterday the middle and latter part the same at 10 A.M. saw a sail a point spoke him the over gear
Died master and spent night so ends
Lat 55-13 S

Thursday 8th the Begins with fine weather standing to the South west the bark he hired the middle and latter part the same on different tacks at sunrise saw a m bark saw white water on turtle so ends
Lat by obs 55-52 S Long by chro 47-48 West

Friday 9th the Begins with a strong breeze from N.W. at sundown took in sail and tacked to the S.W. at daylight a light breeze from S.E. heading S.W. saw porpoises and turtle bore for one did not catch him so ends
Lat 55-55 S Long 47-08 West

Saturday 10th the Begins with a light breeze from S.E. saw a fine clear and pleasant over head the middle luffed by the wind to the S.W. the latter steered S.W. bore for a turtle saw grampuses so ends this 24 hours
Lat by obs 55-55 South Long by chro 46-30 West
