Steered E by S till sundown caught a sunfish broke out main hold for water and old jib found no fish got out two chooses the middle and latter part Steered from E to N.E. saw spouts so ends this 24 hours Lat by obs 56:20 South Long by chro 46:50 West

Monday 12th the Begins with a fine breeze from N.W. Steered East caught a turtle saw a sunfish the middle and latter part Steered in to the North the latter Steered South so ends this 24 hours Lat by obs 56:58 South Long by chro 44:19 West

Tuesday 13th the Begins with light air Steered the same set up main topmast rigging cloudy over head the middle part the same at 12 wind from East at sunrise wore ship to the south caught a turtle out of stern boat Lat by obs 57:12 S Long by chro 44:52 West

Wednesday 14th the Begins with a strong breeze saw several porches on different tanks at sunrise wore ship to the north the middle part moderate the latter part strong breeze saw grampuses so ends this 24 hours Lat by obs 57:14 South Long by chro 45:07 West

Thursday 15th the Begins with a strong breeze from N.E. at 4 P.M. Steered West the middle part the same the latter blowing a gale of wind at sunrise wore ship to the S.E. struck a porpoise S.E. Lat by obs 56:40 South Long by chro 45:30 West

Friday 16th the Begins with a gale of wind from N.E. under close reefed main topsail the middle and latter part the same wind from N.W. Lat by obs 57:04 South Long by chro 45:05 West

Saturday 17th the Begins with more moderate wore ship to the S.W. set fore sail the middle and latter part the same broke out main hold for water and bread so ends this 24 hours Lat by obs 56:00 South Long by chro 45:25 West

Sunday 18th the Begins with a strong breeze from W. broke out after hold for sugar the middle and latter the same this day caught several porches blowing a half gale of wind so ends this at 2 A.M. took a breeze from S.E. tacked to the South Lat by obs 56:05 South Long by chro 46:25 West

Monday 19th the Begins with a strong breeze and roused from South by east at 3 furl. fore to sail the middle part the same at 5 A.M. set fore to sail the latter the same so ends this 24 hours roused Lat by obs 59:02 South Long by chro 46:40 West

Tuesday 20th the Begins with a strong breeze from South set mainsail the middle and latter part moderate wind from S.E. heading S.W. saw junks of squid so ends Lat by obs 59:47 South Long by chro 46:06 West

Wednesday 21th the Begins with a light breeze from S.E. East the Cook and Charles Carrol had a smash I expect they will both by the cox's face is all smashed in and carrol's nose is torn all to pieces the middle and latter part the same Lat by obs 59:20 South Long by chro 46:07 West

Thursday 22th the Begins with a light breeze from S.W. heading S.E. at sundown wore ship to the west the middle and latter part the same took a distance so ends Lat by obs 59:00 South Long by chro 48:54 West

Friday 23th the Begins with a fine breeze from S.E. West saw squid saw a sunfish the middle and latter Calm. bored for grampuses cleaned the vessel out side so ends Lat by obs 59:57 South Long by chro 49:40 West

Saturday 24th the Begins with a light breeze from N.W. West Steered to the west ward saw a barkis and at sail spoke her the inga war-ship sailing a large whale the middle part Steered to the westward at sunrise ran off saw the Elizabeth Mattapoisett so ends this day came on board and spent the day so ends this day Lat by obs 59:08 South Long by chro 49:46 West

Sunday 25th the Begins with a light breeze from N.W. East Steered to the N.E. at sundown tacked to the North the middle and latter part the same saw said bark. All day fine smooth weather as I ever saw it at sea saw grampuses so ends this 24 hours no whale. Lat by obs 59:21 South Long by chro 49:45 West
