Brig. Catharine. In. 15 part of. 1846

Thursday 15 the Begins with breeze more moderate sent the cables and washed off decks wind 282 let go anchor off Sant as 1 1/2 mile from the low Docks At 4 PM in 5 battens mid calm stood. Another watches through the night calm so ends and begins with civil air At 4 in the morning hoist up anchor and tied in the river At 11 let go anchor off the town of Santos 6 1/2 fathoms the Capt sent on shore came on board at 1 dark so ends this day cleared the Brig out side

Friday 16 the Begins fine weather people employed in breaking out the brig sent up the river filled a raft and left it 4 miles up in the woods the Capt Sick & messalls came in to stay the steam boat left here for Rio so ends this day At sundown got on board At 8 PM

Saturday 17 the Begins with cloudy weather people employed to work in the hold At 9 AM sent up the river after the raft got on board At 3 PM and stood half off it down received 48 lbs of fresh beef and other vegetables the Council and a doctor came on board to see the Captain At 8 took a bath so ends this day

Sunday 18 the Begins with thick and cloudy st watch on liberty At sundown came on board all but 6 the Council and doctor came on board to see the Captain At 9 PM the Capt took a bath Benjamin Cook doctor to John Grinnell 100 lbs etc so ends this day At 10 PM Brig went out

Monday 19 the Begins with cloudy the Capt Sick got another raft 15 cask took them on board At 5 PM the doctor came on board sawed up some wood on shore Lewis Ross left the Brig for good took his things on shore the Capt took a injection in the morning at 4 PM two men came on board that left the Board sparten 20 ends this day with all the water on board that we intend to get

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Tuesday 20 the Begins with fine weather aboard watch on liberty all came on board but one received one foot board of wood and 4 sacks of potatoes two sacks of beans the doctor and Council came on board the Capt still sick I bought on 1st night so ends this day stood down the Capt all off decks but 5

Wednesday 21 the Begins with fine weather st watch on liberty the watch on board broke out the pump back oil to go ashore tomorrow 8-40 gallons so ends this day at sundown received a cask of rice on board and some other small notions the Council came on board

Thursday 22 the Begins with the night raining all this day primary landed the oil so 100 lbs aboard watch on liberty Jimmy Lopez and Jack King sent ashore on liberty yesterday and nothing has been seen of them since the parapatanga went out at 4 o'clock - 4 men stayed on shore strong breezes and 80

Friday 23 the Begins with thick and cloudy weather st watch on liberty sent down the fore yard sent the truss a shore to get fire filled up scab salt water on the board side he aft the blubber room peter lock-john & in Corinthen long block stayed on shore at dark a tempest very light so ends

Saturday 24 the Begins with rain and thunder aboard watch on liberty Jacob Scribner scalded his foot started the bands on the fore yard in the afternoon the Capt went on shore on coattails aboard side did nothing of much consequence a small schooner came in with a load of oranges Stephen & Corwell and John the

Sunday 25 the Begins with rain and thick weather st watch on liberty finished battening the Brig the doctor came on board and towards night the Capt sent on shore the st watch went a gunning killed nothing the fixed shroud to stay on shore a steam boat came in to day from Rio de Janeiro no more to write for this day
