 Remarks on Board the U States 1852

Tues 9<sup>th</sup> Begins with a fine breeze from East steered to the S<sup>W</sup> by N Pauline after our the middle and latter squally so and Lat none Long 59° 30' East

Wednes 10<sup>th</sup> Begins with light breezes and squally Pauline off the lee beam At 3 P.M. tacked to the S<sup>W</sup> a strong current setting to the N. the middle and latter the same caught a Sunfish Lat 08° 19' S Long 59° 55' East

Thurs 11<sup>th</sup> Begins with light breezes from S<sup>W</sup> steering to the S<sup>W</sup> saw finbacks Pauline off the lee quarter the middle and latter the same At 3 in the morning tacked ship Lat 8° 08' S Long 60° 8' E

Friday 12<sup>th</sup> Begins with fine weather the Pauline a stern the middle and latter part a fine breeze took a lunar At 9:38 m made the longitude 59° 09' E Lat 09° 35' South

Satur 13<sup>th</sup> Begins with fresh breezes from S<sup>W</sup> E tacked ship to the S<sup>W</sup> saw a Dillar the middle and latter squally took a breeze and tacked S<sup>W</sup> and S<sup>W</sup> and E by S then E with light breezes and strong Lat 09° 30' S Long 59° 37' East

Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> Begins with light breezes and squally steered E when the wind would blow it saw a school of Sunfish At 3 P.M. saw a sail the middle squally the latter light breezes and clear Lat 09° 30' S Long 59° 36' East

Monday 15<sup>th</sup> Begins with light airs and Calms After supper laid a boat after porpoises and struck one the middle and latter light airs in the morning saw the Pauline S<sup>W</sup> Lat 09° 10' S Long 59° 50' East

Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> Begins with light breezes from E S<sup>W</sup> steered to the N<sup>W</sup> ward saw the Bark hope and had a game with Calms and a shark after Dark the middle and latter the same At fall past 6 in the morning tacked ship to the Southward Lat 9° 10' South Long 59° 49' East

Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> Begins with a fine breeze from S<sup>W</sup> E saw 4 Whalesmen 2 to the windward and two to the leeward the middle and latter the same At 4 A.M. saw a sail on the lee beam and one on the weather bow and saw a school of sperm whales led At 8 struck and got 4 St. S. Lat 08° 19' S Lat 9° 30' S Long 59° 24' E

Thurs 18<sup>th</sup> Begins with fine weather (fine whales) but one in to right and commenced boiling one strange Surpuz chased the whales get near the middle and latter fine weather in the morning began cutting but in 2. In fore dinner saw a sail Lat 3° 30' Long 59° 08'

Friday 19<sup>th</sup> Begins with light breezes from E S<sup>W</sup> finished cutting in 4 large cows saw a sail boiling the belly first the middle and latter the same boiling so E. net this Lat 5° 34' S Long 59° 08' East

Sat 20<sup>th</sup> Begins with light airs and Calms Steered all around the compass saw plenty Oliver Bares and finbacks porpoises so Lat 5° 34' S Long 59° 08' East

Sun 21<sup>th</sup> Begins with light airs and Calms Boiling the middle finished boiling cooled away 114 lbs the latter Calms no one in sight so Lat 5° 06' S Long 59°

Monday 22<sup>th</sup> Begins with light airs and Calms Steered to S<sup>W</sup> by E the middle Calm the latter commenced stowing down finished stowing off the spelter ball so Lat 9° 08' S Long 59° 34' East

Tues 23<sup>th</sup> Begins with a fine breeze from S<sup>W</sup> E steered to the S<sup>W</sup> spoke the Katherwood the middle and latter squally stowing down oil saw two sails Lat 9° 00' South Long 59° 30' East

Wednes 24<sup>th</sup> Begins with a strong breeze and squ finished stowing down at dark wore ship to the Eastward the middle and latter squally on the Eastern tack washed off the Decks in the morning so Lat 9° 00' S Lat
