

May the 10 Towards Home

Remarks on Board the United States 1852

The latter part squally after breakfast sent James Parigin in the rigging and belayed him gave him 10 lashes for his disobedience with a Commodore island in sight a long way off Lat 11-45 S Long

Tuesday the 11 Begins with strong breezes and squally heading from S.W. to N.W. wind from S.W. to N.W. at 10 PM took in top gaff and sails and took in mainsail. Saw Focnah all the morning with bearing S.W. the latter part Calms and 15 miles off to the S.

Wednesday the 12 Begins with Calms At 1:30 PM saw Black fish, pellicla and Commodore in sight At 5 PM took a strong breeze from S.W. the middle part strong breezes let go. I anchor in Juan ah in 14 fathoms the black bird found by in there with no oil on board the governor Hopkins by in here to win 10 lbs of sperm leaking very bad the Captain of the fish man was on shore sick set up 8 sheets for water did nothing more this day

Thursday the 13 Begins with strong breezes and squally After dark went a gun in the middle and latter the same got off a raft of water 30 lbs and stole it away the Captain on shore so glad

Friday the 14 Begins with light breezes and squally the middle and latter light breezes this day is Sunday with the arals received from the shore 150 punkins got out flour and bread a boat came from Commodore

Saturday the 15 Begins with light breezes off the land the middle and latter the same S.W. to N.W. on shore Got off 2 Boat load of wood so glad

Sunday the 16 Begins with fine weather Took dinner on shore the middle and latter the same in the morning the Brig Grosian in sight she came in At 10 AM so glad

Monday the 17 Begins with fine weather an Arab stole the mates watch caught him and put him in irons kept him on board all night the middle and latter light breezes and squally hove up the anchor and left port at 9 AM the fishman left a boat so glad we started to

Czera Pickins Master Towards Home 1852

Tues the 18 Begins with light breezes and shifts of wind At Sundown had a game with Back dove 9 m out 10 lbs and game with the richness the Captain and mate sick and two foremost hands the fish man in sight till 1 PM I saw a rather sail steering towards Focnah the middle light breeze the latter strong steering by the wind to the S.W. wind from S.W. Lat 12-30 S Long 14-15

Wednesday the 19 Begins with fresh breezes from S.W. heading S.W. the middle and latter light airs and Calms after breakfast saw breeches on the lee been run for there saw him no more Lat 14-25 S Long 12-58 East

Thursday the 20 Begins with light airs and Calms heading to the W.S.W. fish of all kinds the 16 of this month. Peter went on board the fishman took an over for his wage same day to a man from the Gov Hopkins as passenger the middle and latter the same Lat the fore student in the morning had a light breeze from N.W. still S.W. by S Lat 14-35 - Long East 42-47

Friday the 21 Begins with light airs and Calms wind from off quarters mended mainsails the middle and latter the same repaired shank so glad Lat 14-53 S Long 42-21 East

Saturday the 22 Begins with light airs from E to S.W. steered by the wind to the S.W. the middle and latter light breezes sharper haul on the wind heading from N.W. to S.W. Lat 15-46 S Long 40-58

Sunday the 23 Begins with light breezes from South the middle and latter the same heading from S.W. to S.W. Lat 17-15 South Long 40-25 East

Monday the 24 Begins with light air from South the middle and latter Calms rain squalls and black fish so glad Lat 19-00 S Long 40-15

Tuesday the 25 Begins with Calms at dark light air from Northward coarse to S.W. the middle and latter the same Lat 19-02 S Long 39-57 East

Wednesday the 26 Begins with light breezes from S.W. heading to the Westward the middle fresh gales and squally the latter the same saw a Brigantine so glad Lat 19-00 S Long 39-15 East
