Remarks on Board the States A D 1862

Thursday the 17 Begins with a fine breeze from E to SE
steered NW by N till dark then steered west. At sundown
saw the land 40 miles off bearing NW to SW. The
middle part strong breezes from E to SE. At
daylight heaved up on the wind heading NW by N
the latter wind from NW by N Lat 35° 30' S Long 24° 00' E

Friday the 18 Begins with strong breezes from NW to NW
At 3 took to the North took in fore topsail and
sail and gaff topsail saw a sail out board bound
the middle a gale filled fore topsails and foresail
close reefed the main the latter moderate all
sail set saw a steamer and a ship out board bound
wind from S steered to the west and Lat 35° 02' S Long 22° 50'

Sat the 19 Begins with light breezes from S saw
a sail out board the middle and latter a fine breeze
from E to SE steered NW by N in the morning
steered NW by N Lat 35° 00' S Long 20° 30' East

Sunday the 20 Begins with light breezes from N to NE
At 1 o'clock saw Cape Lagullas 30 miles off bearing
NW by N At sundown bore NW by N with a S by N
breeze the middle part wind all around the compass
the latter part a steady breeze from E toward land
40 miles off Cape Lagullas Lat 35° 16' S Long 19° 38' by the

Monday the 21 Begins with a light breeze from East
ward steered NW by N at sundown saw the
Mountain and the Cape of Good Hope the middle and
latter light airs from every point saw a school of
blackfish and a sail Lat 35° 12' S Long by the 18000

Tuesday the 22 Begins with light airs from SW saw
the Cape of Good Hope and a sail the middle
part the same the latter took a breeze from
SW by S hailed round to the South saw a sail
steering towards the Cape Lat 34° 55' S Long 18° 40' East

Wednesday the 23 Begins with a fresh breeze from SE
steered NW by N the middle and latter the
same to E Lat 33° 19' S Long

Thursday the 24 Begins with strong breezes from
SE steered NW by N saw a London Steam ship
went with in sail the middle and latter more
moderate sent up fore royal yard with
the sail Lat 31° 45' S Long 12° 10' East

June the 25
Cyra Pickens Master H Board in June

Friday the 25 Begins with a fine breeze from SW
steered NW by N half N the middle and latter wind
from NW to NW in the morning saw a English
Bark standing with us with light breezes

Sat the 26 Begins with light breezes from NW
the middle and latter light airs wind from NW to west
the Bark Columbia a miles off At 9 AM the Capt
went on board stopped all day in the afternoon
the mates came here stopped till dark so E mls
At 12 Lat 29° 26' S Long 10° 19' East

Sunday the 27 Begins with light breezes from west
Gamin with an English Bark she belonged to
shields the middle and latter the same saw ship
in sight Lat 28° 34' S Long 9° 00' East

Monday the 28 Begins with light breezes from SE
steering NW by N the bark Columbia a stern
the middle and latter the same moderate gale
Lat 27° 58' S Long 07° 30' E

Tuesday the 29 Begins with a light breeze from
SE steered NW by N the Columbia in sight
a stern rose a nother sail 2 points on the
latter the same then sail in sight steering the
same Lat 27° 00' S Latte Long 5° 57' East

Wednesday the 30 Begins with light breezes from SE
steered NW by N one sail in sight ahead the
middle and latter the same so E Lat 26° 00' Long 4° 50'

Thursday the 31 Begins with light airs and calms one
July sails in sight repaired fore topsail At 10 PM
took a light breeze from NW and it hauled
around to the S steered NW by N in the morning
had a fresh breeze Lat 25° 06' S Long 3° 40' E

Friday the 1 Begins with a fine breeze from SE
steered NW by N the middle and latter
light breezes Lat 24° 00' S Long 1° 50' East

Saturday the 2 Begins with light airs from SE to SE
steered NW by N the middle and latter light airs
and calms from all parts of the compass East
off the St Johns sails 30 S mls this 24 hours
Lat 23° 15' S Long by Chron 120° East
