

Sunday July the 4
Remarks, on Board, the U. States A. S. 1852.

July the 4 Begins with light airs from S.W.
S. & steered S.W. by W. till 4 P.M. for the 4th
the middle and latter the same S. & ends this day
Lat by obs 22° 35' S Long 00° 40' E by Calc.

Monday the 5 Begins with light airs from S. to E.
steered S.W. by W. At 11 P.M. took a light breeze
from S.E. and squally the latter the same washed
ship inside S. & Lat 21° 45' S Long 00° 00' E or W

Tuesday the 6 Begins with light breezes from S.E. steered
S.W. by W. same as sail off the St. Beem showing to
the westward the middle and latter a fine breeze
same said sail Lat 20° 20' S Long 02° 40' West

Wednesday the 7 Begins with strong breezes from S.E.
steered S.W. by W. with stiff breezes the middle
and latter strong breezes in the morning said
ship close to a French man Lat 18° 04' S Long 4° 25' W

Thursday the 8 Begins with strong breezes from
S.E. steered S.W. by W. the middle steered S.W. by W.
luffed by the wind to the eastward At daylight
steered S.W. by W. At 7:30 saw St. Helena bearing
S by E half E 80 miles off thick and squally blowing
a close reefed tops breeze let go anchor
off James town in 16 fathoms of water and English
Bark came in At 3 o'clock we dropped anchor
About 1 P.M. 3 other vessels in with us

Friday the 9 Begins with strong breezes and squally
the middle part the same the latter toward
watch went on shore St. watch painted the
stern and cleaned the St. side of the ship 2
English m. Barks sailed at sundown for London
Got two observations Long 5° 02' West

Satur. the 10 Begins with strong breezes and squally
the middle part the same latter St. watch
on shore Lab. watch took the water on board
62 bbls S. & E.

Sunday the 11 Begins with strong breezes and squally
the middle and latter the same St. watch on
shore to come off to sight a French
ship went out two English ships came
in a latter one passed the island

July the 12 1852

Monday July the 12 Begins with thick squally weather
the middle and latter the same several sails
came in English Barks and French and Swedish
the Captain on shore no one else so ends this

Tuesday the 13 Begins with a fresh breeze and no
rain all hands on board but the Captain.
Several sails went out the middle and latter
the same so ends this 24 hours

Wednesday the 14 Begins with light breezes several
sails came in and went out the middle
and latter the same so ends this 24 hours
the middle part fine At 8 in the morning
hoisted up the anchor and steered S.W. by W. with fine
weather and smooth the Capt. took a boy from St. Hel.
At 12 the land just in sight so ends this 24 hours

Thursday the 15 Begins with light breezes from S.E.
steered S.W. by W. At 4 St. Helena out of sight and
we are bound home the middle and latter light
breezes so ends Lat 14° 10' S Long 07° 40' West

Friday the 16 Begins with a fine breeze from
S.E. to S.W. steered S.W. by W. 4 people employed
making spungarn and painting the iron
work the middle and latter the same painted
waterways and set up m. topmast rigging one side
so ends Lat 12° 46' S Long 9° 40' West

Satur. the 17 Begins with a fine breeze from
S.E. to East employed painting saw five barks
Charles B. and line two barks off the middle
and latter the same Lat by obs 11° 25' S Long 11° 00' W

Sunday the 18 Begins with a fine light breeze from
S.W. and saw five barks sail a sail people employed
painting and taring and setting up topmast rigging
the middle and latter a fine breeze so ends
this 24 hours Lat 10° 54' S Long 13° 50' West

Monday the 19 Begins with a fine breeze from
S.E. steered S.W. by W. the middle and latter
part the same people employed setting
down fore and main rigging and taring
down Lat 8° 25' S Long 16° 20' West
