Southward & Westward of Bermuda.
Thursday April 27th 1845

These 24 hours commenced with light air
from the Northward & Eastward. Course S E. Watch
Employed in Ships duty. Wind to and latter
part light air from S E. Shoring S E
Watch Employed in Ships duty. Saw 2 dark Shanties S W
Lat 30° 31' Long 101°

Friday 28th P.M. There no hours light air and fine
 weather Ship heading to S.W. 8.
 Lat Long 68.20 W 15

Saturday 29th Where 24 hours. barometer
with Light air from S.E. Ship heading
to S.E. At midday part Light air and
calm. Saw a vessel standing to South
Latter part Light air Ship heading S.E. by E. 16
Lut Long

Sunday 30th Four hours with light air & calm
 Skirtle to part equally with rain Ship heading
 N.E. Latter part smart breeze from N.E. & E
 Ship heading E by N. Perfect with fine weather
 Lat. 30° 33' Long. 17°

Monday May 1st 1848 Commenced with a fair
breeze from North and East blowing Ebb. At Loken
port 2 Barks in sight So ended with backing wind.
Lat Long 18

Sunday 2^d
 Commences with Light air from
 All quarters & Sail in sight. Letter from
 Ship's heading E & S.
 Lat 31 n 30 Long 61 w 19

Wednesday May 3rd 1848
Bark Catherwood off Atlantic Ocean
(Whale) Bound East. Thursday 3rd

A head of 3 sp. Whales lowered all three
 Boats but without success, as they were
 a going quite to seaward. At 5 PM
 lowered a gain but could not catch them.
 At sunset look in sail heading in 9 PM. At 10
 more sail, to E. S. Later part made
 all sail. Saw nothing of the Whales
 one sail in sight off the quarter. (Boat broken)
 Go on. L. H. 31228 Long, 6h. 24 M
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Thursday 4th All first part Smart breeze
Katie & Lattie ports Smart breeze
and Marie saw nothing h/

Friday 5th
There 2 1/2 hours bloommen with light
wind from all quarters. Lett Long

Sat. Munday 6th
 1. Breeze with
 Light air from all parts
 Rain - 1. Calm
 but Salt Sea
