

Barb. Lotherwood Home war bound
Thursday July 18th 1850

Came more to the north of the line with
a fine breeze from S.E. At first past 8 P.M.
passed a ship steering to S.W. Later part
saw a bark steering the same course & ends
employed painting spars &c. Course North.
Lat 21° 58' North.

Friday 19th All this day fine breeze from
S.E. & steering North. Lat 5.00 North.

Saturday 20th All this day strong winds from
S.E. & steering North. Saw 2 sail steering
to S.W. No obs.

Sunday 21st All this day strong wind from
South. steering N.W. & N.E. saw one sail
steering to S.W. Lat 9.50 North Long

Monday 22nd All this day strong winds
from South. to N.W. steering North.
The first part fine weather Middle part raining
Later part a little of both (saw a bark steering to S.W.)
Lat 12.04 N. Long 26.02 W

Tuesday 23rd All these 24 hours light air from
all quarters & calms, with a little rain
to make it pleasant. Lat 12.30 N. Long 26.21 West

Wednesday 24th Commences with fine weather.
& calm with some rain Middle part took the
S.E. breeze steering N.W. & N.E. Later part
heading N.W. & N.E. sharp on a wind. saw
2 sail all steering to S.W.
Lat 13.20 Long 26.25 W

Barb. Lotherwood a going home, around Robin Hood's Barn.
Thursday July 25th 1850

All this day strong breeze (S.E.) heading N.W. & N.E. by S.W.
saw 2 sail. Lat 14.40 N. Long 29.18 West.

Friday 26th All this day strong breeze
this weather steering S.W. & N.E.
Lat 16.04 N. Long

Saturday 27th All this day fine weather
& a fine breeze from S.E. steering S.W. & N.E.
Lat 16.00 N. Long 32.27 West

Sunday 28th All this day strong winds
from N.E. & East. steering S.W. & N.W. & N.E.
Later part saw a sail steering to Westward
Lat 20.14 N. Long 34.08 West

Monday 29th All this day as tedious as the
rest. steering N.W. Lat 22.40 N. Long 35.40 West

Tuesday 30th This day commenced with pleasant
weather & gentle S.E. breeze. steering N.W. for the
Western Ground (5 Bbls of meat) our Captain
I suppose after much consultation within his own mind
came to the conclusion to go home. therefore after 8 O'clock
in the evening he (Baldy) kept her off W. 1/2 S.
but after a fine forel sleep, he got up in the morning
at 6 & took in their royal & braced up the yards
& kept her off the old course again, so End of poor
man dare not go home. (he is putting the cable
day after day) saw 2 sail & repaired the
rigging. Lat 23.25 N. Long 37.53 West
