Employed setting up rigging
Lat 4.30 S Long 51.00 E

674 Thursday 7th All this day fresh gales
from the Northward Steady W.S.W.
Employed setting up rigging
Lat 5.26 S Long 49.00

675 Friday 8th (26 years old Op. Dur)
All this day smart breeze
from the North Steady W.S.W. first part
Employed finished setting up rigging

676 Saturday 9th All this day smart breeze
from the North Steady W.S.W.

677 Sunday 10th All this 24 smart breeze
and fair steady first part W.S.W. Middle part
on a wind heading to N.W. Latter part Steady
to N. so ends strong winds

678 Monday 11th These 24 hours commences with
smart winds all first part 4 P.M. made the
Island of Aldabra
At dark saw a fire on the Island. Latter
part heard in noise a boat came off, proved to be
a Frenchman & 4 or 5 natives from Mayke after
Turtle shell & Turtles Ends with Boat a shore

Aldabra not inhabited

Bark: bathowoo bound to Aldabra
Tuesday Feb 12th 1850

679 This day fine weather At first part Boat
came off with 24 Turtles & 8 Boats went
in and got 6 Turtles. Middle part steady
off shore Latter part in shore Ends with
fine weather the Island in sight

680 Wednesday 13th All this day fine weather
At latter part spoke Bark Beane Haller of Turhaven
21 Moⁿ 500 lbs. so ends in company with the Beane
Lat 5.56 S

681 Thursday 14th All this day light air and fine
weather in company with the Beane

682 Friday 15th All this 24 hours light air &
calm Lat Long

683 Saturday 16th Commences & Ends with
calm Lat Long

684 Sunday 17th All this day calm

685 Monday 18th All this 24 hours light
air and calm Lat Long

686 Tuesday 19th All this 24 winds light
and calm road & then all first part saw
the Island of Aldabra
Latter part out of sight strong current
setting to South
