 48 1/2 days from West Port, Sunday August 17<sup>th</sup> 1849

All this 24 hours light air and  
 buffing wind all first part 2 P.M.  
 spoke Bark Cornelia level 11 1/2 hrs from  
 New Bedford 400 P.M. latter the Bark  
 in sight Lat 16° 30' S Long 43° 34' E

413 Monday 18<sup>th</sup> First and middle parts  
 of this day light air & variable winds  
 latter part strong wind from N.W. heading too  
 N & West Lat 16° 30' Long 41° 50' E

414 Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> All these 24 hours  
 strong wind first & middle parts heading  
 too N & E latter part too Westward  
 latter part & all spoke Bark Cornelia  
 Enes German Lat 16° 30' Long

415 Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> All this day strong  
 breeze and rigger first part heading  
 with the Bark. middle and latter parts  
 heading over our head for some middle  
 and latter parts heading too N & E.  
 Lat 16° 40' Long 41° 50' E

416 Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> All this day  
 strong winds the gathering  
 a trying too get too of shore  
 Lat 16° 40' Long 42° 10' E

*Bark Catherine of Comore*,  
 Bound for Johnson, Friday August 14<sup>th</sup> 1849

417 All this 24 hours strong wind  
 Fair & Fair Lat 16° 58' Long 40° 54' E

418 Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> This day commences  
 with strong wind as usual on opposite  
 Tacks (went too get in to Port) Lat 16° 30' Long 40° 42'

419 Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> Commences with fine breeze &  
 fair weather all 3 P.M. saw a Bark too windward  
 middle & latter parts light air & calm  
 Lat 18° 30' Long 40° 31'

500 Monday 29<sup>th</sup> Commences with a light breeze  
 from the North & East (Fair wind & fair tide)  
 middle part fine breeze latter part light air  
 and calm. (Returning from N.W. E too N.E. E)  
 latter part employed repairing chain sail  
 Lat 18° 30' Long 41° 46' E

501 Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> Commences with calm  
 weather all first part finished chain sail  
 & bent it middle part calm latter part  
 saw the Island of Comore, Lat 18° 30' Long 41° 46' E

502 Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> Commences with light air and  
 fine weather all 5 P.M. saw the Isle of Mohela  
 about 2 miles too windward. At 10 saw the  
 Isle of Johana steering East (sent the cables)
