

Bark Lotherwood bound to Tristan & St. Helena
Friday December 1st 1848

233 This day commenced with smart breeze from S.W.
At 3 P.M. wind hauled out S.W. starting S.E. & S.
All Middle part under short sail in the morning & on
in sight. Latter part Wind S.W. starting for the Land

(Landing on S.W. side)



234 Saturday 2nd (Tristan & St. Helena)

First part of these 24 hours off the
Island gained with Bark Mors of New Bedford
3 M^{rs} blow. Middle part standing off & on latter
part to suggest to land.

235 Sunday 3rd

First & Middle part blowing heavy
from the S.W. under short sail. At 5 P.M. saw a
Whale going to windward. Latter part rather moderating
blowing up to the Land. Wind S.W. a ship in sight to
leeward.



236 Monday 4th At first part saw a boat in to the land
for fish. Middle part wind hauled out S.W. at daylight
off the Land. Captain went on shore. 8 boats came
on board. At 11 commenced blowing S.W. & S.
hauling off from the Land. The ship off our weather quarter

237 Tuesday 5th Commenced with a fresh gale from the S.W.
Close kept ship in ship off weather quarter
blowing S.W. and blowing a heavy gale from the S.W. & East
with rain. At sunset weather cleared from the side of Inexpressible
a boat of us blew to the ship & pulled the side of Tristan & St. Helena
under our lee. From close reef topsails set double reefed main
sails & spanker. At 11 O'clock clear of the weather point of the Land
took in all to close reef main topsails hauling S.W. wind shifted to S.W.
from the ship had made S.W. lower hauling S.W. Latter part rather moderating.

Bark Lotherwood off Tristan & St. Helena

233 Wednesday December 6th 1848
First & Middle part light winds trying to get up
to the Land. Latter part calm ship 16 miles from the
Land. Set 3 boats in for potatoes. saw 1 ship. Several
Lumpden of New Bedford Laying off & on.

234 Thursday 7th

All first part got a
breeze ship got up to the Land. got off 4 boats
load of potatoes. Middle part Laying off & on
on Captain a shore. Latter part Captain on
board. Lower boats on left the Island
Laying off & on.

235 Friday 8th

All these 24 hours fresh gale from
the Northward blowing S.W. & S.W. & S. Latter part
saw 10 Whales.

236 Saturday 9th

This 24 hours smart gale from
the Northward. Commenced S.W. & S. Latter part saw a
Bark starting Eastward. Lat 34° 45' Long 60° W

237 Sunday 10th

This day commenced with fine weather
and light air from the Westward. Middle part light air and
calm. Latter part light air & foggy. Starting from
S.W. to S.W. & S. Saw a school of Whales several
all three boats ends blowing Whales
