Wednesday June 7th 1848

60 with strong breeze in squalls of rain.
Made 6 in latter part the same
55 Lat Long

Thursday 8th These 24 hours commenced
with strong breeze Middle & latter parts light
breeze. Watch employed filling up Riggings.
56

Friday 9th Commenced with fine weather
& light airs Middle & latter part the same
Latter part fine weather employed a Taring down
Riggings & course N.E. & S.
57 Lat 32-40 N. Long 42-46 W

Saturday 10th At first part
Steering N.E. by E. Middle & latter parts
58 Steering E. by S. Lat Long

Sunday 11th All these 24 hours fine
weather & light airs from the Northward
59 Lat 32-17 N. Long

Monday 12th These 24 hours commenced
with fine weather at 3 P.M. saw a large
lower mast fully bent supposed to be long E.
a large ship Middle & latter parts light
60 air and fine weather Lat Long

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61 Tuesday June 13th 1848
These 24 hours
light airs & calms. Employed doing little at
sailing Lat Long

Wednesday 14th All these 24 hours
light airs & calms. At first part saw
Black fish. Landed all three boats but
without success. Lat Long

Thursday 15th These 24 hours commenced
with fine weather and light breeze from the Eastward
At latter part saw 7 sails. one we spoke
Berig Countess of London. 60 days from North West
bound to London. short of Bread etc. supplied her
wants. Lat 32-18 N. Long 41-37

Friday 16th All these 24 hours fine
weather. At first part saw 15 sails of vessels
& all Merchantmen. At Middle part saw
one. Latter part 4 sails in sight all steering
to North & E. Lat Long

Saturday 17th All these 24 hours
fine breeze from South by East
Saw 2 sails standing to North & E.
saw Black fish 2 or 3 but without
success. Steering to N.E. & W.
Lat 33-24 N. Long 43-20
