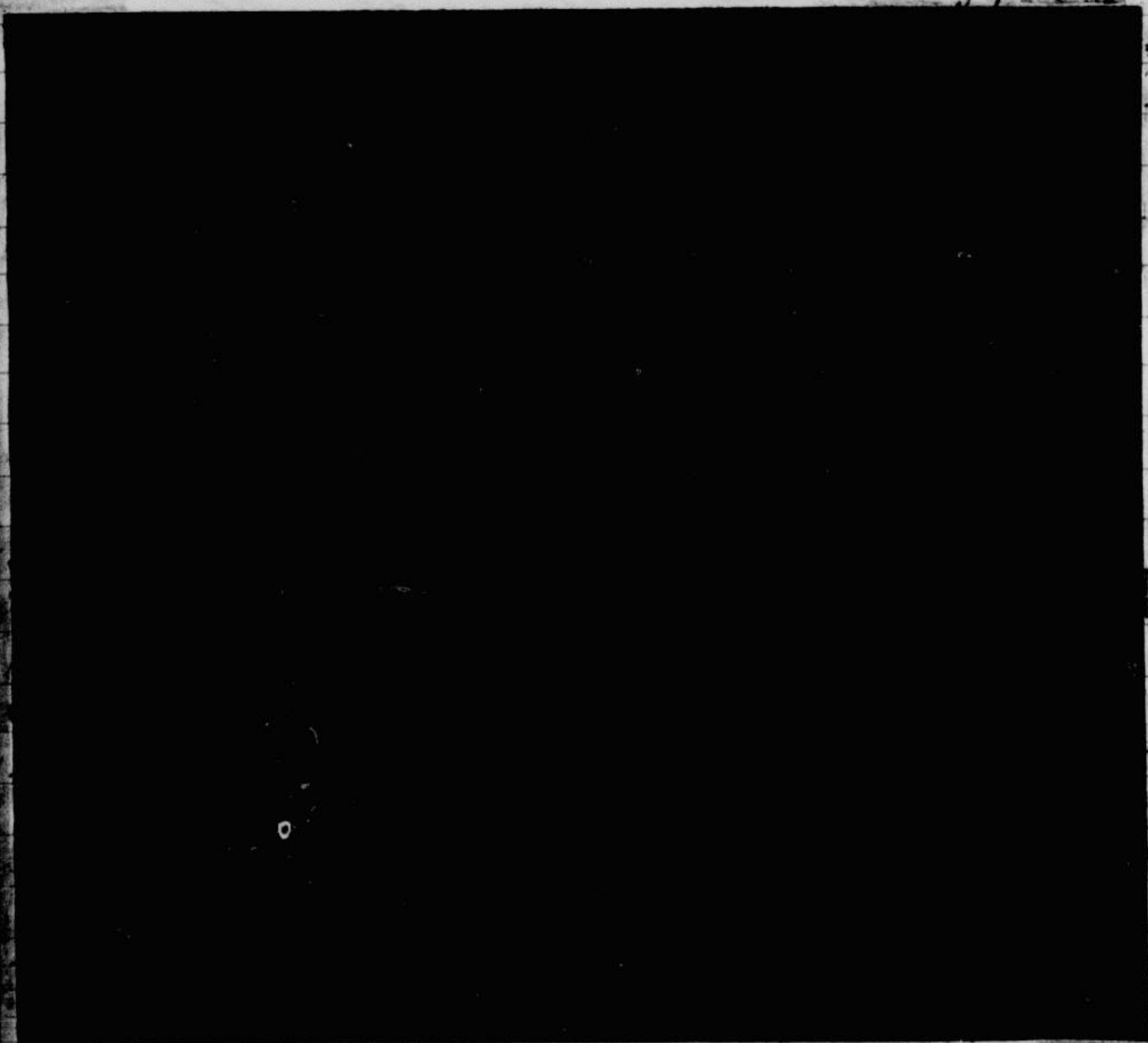

5 go. at 10 o'clock, we went aboard of the ship in going down to the Boat the officer walked behind me and the other two men walked in front of me so escape I could not, so I had to go aboard. Below you will see a representation of the bay and Island 92 miles from Hobart.

got aboard all safe. next morning the Captain called me aft. and says to me what was you trying to do yesterday I told him nothing. that I got left behind and missed the Boat. he said it was no such a thing. But I shall furnish you you can go forward now. During our stay there we cut and brought aboard 20 tons of wood. Heard and soft to get there. On Monday, April 25th 1870 we hove up our anchor and went outside to cruise for whales. Without any success for a while we thought of Port that we should go to Kangaroo Island. and try there. arriving there on the 10th of May. we had the delightful pleasure of seeing Whales in abundance but we could not have the luck to get any or get any whales near them. During these some times. When thought it was best for us to go in to port as our main mast was sprung so bad that we could not have cut any more whales in had we got any more. Leaving Kangaroo Island for Hobart town on the last day of June. Arriving of the pillars on the 14th day of July 1870 with a back wind and light.
