Tuesday, July 20th — 1875.
 Fine Clear weather. Wind S.W. got under way at 12.30. 1.15 o'clock in getting under way and an hour into a schooner, starting her up and breaking her. David and her wheel, passed out by Boston Light, fine wind and then heeled up, for contact with Nahant, passed down by, Legare Reef, Marblehead, Salem, Hatches Island, Beverly. Arriving in Gloucester Mass. 6 P.M.

Wednesday, July 21st — 1875.
 Fine Clear weather In the morning got under way. Wind W.S.W. at 8.45. left. Beat out of the Harbor, passed Hatches Island lights. Wind hauled to S.W. Passed down by, Rockland, Spanish Bay, Newburyport and Salisbury arriving at Isle of Shoals, layed there at anchor till 5 o'clock, when we got under way and squared yards for Portsmouth N.H. with main sail, jib and flying jib on her, heavy sea on blowing fresh. Breeze came to anchor, 15 minutes to Dix in Portsmouth. Rainy after supper and then calm and clear weather during the evening.

Thursday, July 22nd — 1875.
 Layed in Portsmouth all day and night. In the morning Clear and Cloudy weather. Wind W. and W.S.W. Went up to the City in the morning. In the big street of the all day. In the afternoon thick and foggy. Wind S.W. came aboard at 5 o'clock. In the afternoon, foggy during the evening.

Friday, July 23rd — 1875.
 Foggy and Rainy weather all day long. Wind E. and N.E. Fresh Breeze during the day. Cleared off in the evening.

Saturday, July 24th — 1875.
 Fine Clear weather Wind N.W. Light Breeze. During the day got under way from Newcastle Portsmouth River at 6.50. got out of the River stood over to Isle of Shoals, distance 6 miles got over there let go anchor, in 13 fathom of water. Went ashore with the gig, at Star Island the Regatta started at 12 o'clock, we followed them for about 8 miles when we turned back to Star Island again, discharged our lady passengers, and made all sails for the Vineyard, fair wind. Moderate.
