Thursday August 18<sup>th</sup> 1875  
 Foggy. Wind. Rainy Weather in the Morning  
 got under way from the Breakwater at  
 Black Island, at 12 o'clock. U. M.  
 under fore sail, Main Sails, Jib and Flying  
 Jib. Made the Run from Black Island  
 to San and Pig's Light; ship in 3 hours  
 distance 30 miles. Squally Weather light  
 drizzling rain when off. Robinsons Hole  
 a sudden squall struck us, which  
 compelled us to take our Main sail  
 in, and Run under fore sail, and  
 Jib, when off Torpaulin Cove Breeze began  
 to run stronger, took our fore sail, in  
 and reefed our Main sail, and  
 Run into Holmes Hole, and let go anchor  
 for the night. Wind during the day S.W. & S.

Friday August 20<sup>th</sup> 1875 Light fog  
 in the Morning Fresh Breeze. Wind S.W.  
 Entered our yacht in the Regatta that was to  
 take place. There being only two of us, in  
 the first Class Schooners, Alia and Estelle,  
 the race being from the Judges Boat to  
 Cape Poge, Bury, the around Cross Key  
 Light, Light Boat, then L. Howland Bury,  
 on port Hand, Hedge House, on Starboard Hand,  
 Making a distance of 3.2 Miles, altogether, making  
 the race in 3.2, 3.3, seconds, Beating the whole by 7/8

This Nugget of gold, was found at Moliagul  
 Victoria Australia. It was the largest nugget  
 of gold found in that Country. It was  
 valued at 10,000 thousand Pound sterling  
 when first found. Its weight after being  
 measured, was 268.10.6. It was sold by  
 the small pieces at 30 each. These other  
 pictures at the back, are views, taken  
 from the New Zealand, Herald, in Australia  
 and New Zealand, of which I am Witness
