Friday 11th

Lat. AC 47-10. Friday Commenced with very light wind from the N.E. steering N. by N. West under all sail. Middle part. Wind N. West later part 2 o'clock S.E. 10 P.M. S.E. steering N. by N. West under all sail thick haze weather, with sheet

Saturday 12th

Lat. AC 49-11 Saturday Commenced with strong breeze from E by South steering N. by N. West under all sail thick haze weather 3 o'clock took in top-galant sails 5 o'clock Double reefed the top sails. took in main sail & jib. Middle and later part of this day moderate gales from N.E. bying the under close reefed main top sail 8 o'clock P.M. set the fore sail, to-day in the act of taking up one of the fore top sail rings a felt over board. Wreck a Boat & saved him &c.

Sunday 13th

Sunday Commenced with moderate gales from the North-East by the wind to N.W. under close reefed main top sail & fore sail 7 o'clock A.M. were ship to eastward 12 o'clock were back again 6 o'clock P.M. set fore & main top sails double reefed 7 o'clock came in sight of Rankon Island bearing N.W. 1/2 West by compass. 9 o'clock tacked off from the land & made all sail middle part of this day strong winds from N.E. by North later part of the day light winds clear weather. saw no ship &c.

Monday 14th

Lat. AC 50-15 Monday Commenced with a light breeze from the N.E. steering by the winds to the N. West under all sail 8 o'clock A.M. Rankon Island bearing West by compass by the winds heading North under all sail middle part strong breezes from S.E. steering N. by E. East later part of the day moderate gales from South steering North by East half East double reefed top sail thick haze weather with snow &c.

Tuesday 15th

Lat 52-00 N. Tuesday Commenced with a moderate gale from S.E. on by N.E. 154-46 laying too under close reefed main top sail & fore top mast staysail ahead the extreme tack middle part of this day steering North under close reefed main top sail & fore sail later part of the day E. N.E. under double reefed fore & main top sails & fore sail all of this day thick haze weather with snow squalls

Wednesday 16th

Lat 53-48 N. Wednesday Commenced with strong wind from S.W. steering E. N.E. under double reefed fore & main top sails & fore sail, the middle & later part of this day steering North by W. 9 o'clock made all sail light wind from S.E. with snow &c.

Thursday 17th

Thursday Commenced with a light breeze from the N.E. by the winds to the North under all sail 2 o'clock tacked to the Eastward 7 o'clock tacked back to the Westward took top galant sails & flying jib 2 o'clock tacked back to the N.E. & middle part later part of this day strong winds & clear rather cool
