Thursday June 14th

Lat 56-29 N.
Long 144-03 W.

Thursday commenced with calm the middle & later part of this day very light breeze from the West. Wind steering by the wind to the South under all. thick fog by spells

Friday 15th

Friday commenced with a light breeze from the West steering by the wind to the South. Spoke ship North Star & 6 whales this day. The middle and later part light wind with light fog by spells. Great quantity of ice Jones Island bearing W. S. W. distant two leagues

Saturday 16th

Lat 56-18 N.
Long 143-16 W.

Saturday commenced with a very light breeze from the N. W. by the wind to the S. W. Spoke ship Charles Carroll & 6 whales this day. Later part of the day calm 24 ships in sight

Sunday 17th

Sunday commenced with a light breeze from the S. West steering through the ice to the S. West. Middle & later part strong breeze from the S. West standing off & on the ice. 10 o'clock lured the boats went in the ice saw no whales 15 ships in sight two being Jones Islands bearing S. E. distant 10 miles



Monday 18th

Monday commenced with a strong breeze from the S. W. Boats in the ice. about 3 o'clock saw a dead whale. Went to him found him good brought him to the ship cut him & e. the middle and later part of this day strong breeze from the S. W. laying off and on the ice. the island bearing S. E. by South 20 miles distant

Tuesday 19th

Tuesday commenced with a light breeze from the N. S. W. off and on the ice. middle and later part of this day very light wind from the East. Wind fine clear weather plenty ice no whales 22 ships in sight 6 boats in sight

Wednesday 20th

Wednesday commenced with a very light breeze from West. Wind laying off and on the ice. middle and later part strong wind from N. S. W. laying off and on the ice. Jones Island bearing E. S. E. 30 miles distant

Thursday 21st

Thursday commenced with a light breeze from the East. Wind laying off and on the ice. saw a plenty of whales. Spoke ship Abigail Capt. Baker 11 whales later part thick fog

Friday 22nd

Friday commenced with a light wind from the West by the wind to the South laying aback thick fog middle and later part thick fog laying too in the ice in company with the aback

Saturday 23rd

Saturday commenced with light winds from the S. E. laying aback heading to the eastward. middle and later part of this day thick fog saw one whale lured the boats no success. Spoke ship 15 whales

Sunday 24th

Sunday commenced with light winds from E. S. E. laying to upon the eastern tack thick fog. the middle and later part of this day thick fog with light breeze from E. S. E. laying with the head yards aback in the edge of the ice
