Monday 25th

Monday commenced with light winds & thick fog from E.N.E. laying aback in the edge of the ice. The middle and later part light winds from the S.E. Later part of the day clear spoke Ship Geo Washington of Warham & got the Boat that we lost down in 15.00

Tuesday 26th

Tuesday commenced with very light breezes from the N.W. by the winds to the west were along the edge of the ice 5 o'clock saw a dead whale in the ice took him alongside & cut him in 4 later part thick fog heading to West West Boiling

Wednesday 27th

Wednesday commenced with very light winds from the E.S.E. thick fog laying with the main yard aback in the ice later part of the day light fog 9 P.M. saw a whale load the boats in chas. no success 25 fathoms light 3 Boiling

Thursday 28th

Thursday commenced with a very light breeze from the W.S.W. by the winds to the North-west boiling 6 o'clock hauled down the later part of this day stowing down the middle & later part of this day thick fog by spells spoke ships E life Adams & Omega

Friday 29th

Friday commenced with light winds from the E.S.E. laying with the main yard aback the middle and later part of this day light winds S.E. steering by the wind to S.W. thick fog the most of the 10 o'clock P.M. load the Boats for a bow head no success

Saturday 30th

Saturday commenced with light wind! from S.E. by the winds to S.W. the middle and later part of this strong wind from E.S.E. by the winds to the South 11 o'clock P.M. spoke Ship Lygia Capt Leonard two whales Bark Gentleman of Sag Harbor

Sunday July 1st

Sunday commenced with light winds from E.S.E. steering by the winds to the South ice & land in sight 7 o'clock shortened sail for the night. The middle and later part of this day fine weather saw several whales but very wild Round Island bearing West 18 mls distant spoke Ship Rebecca killed 2 whales Thom. Age 5

Monday 2nd

Monday commenced with light winds from the West by the winds. The middle and later part of this day very light winds saw a few whales but very wild Round Island bearing West 14 mls distant

Tuesday 3rd

Tuesday commenced with a very light breeze from S.E. laying with the main yard aback plenty whales very wild middle part of this day by the wind to N.E. East 6 P.M. tacked to the West 10 o'clock came to the ice tacked back to the East head again. middle and later part thick fog

Wednesday July 4th

Wednesday commenced with light winds from the N.W. by the winds to the east-west under hole topails. middle and later part moderate gales from the North West. 9 o'clock dybb reefed the topails & set the fore sail thick rainey weather with Rain
