

Friday 14th July

Thursday commenced with a very light
winds from most all points of the compass laying with
the main yard aback Boiling. Later part light winds
from East & thick fog

Sunday 15th

Sunday commenced with light winds from East
by the winds to the South under double reefed
top sails. Boiling the middle and later part of this day
thick fog with light winds from North & N.E. by the
winds with the main yard aback Boiling Spoke Bark
Corvinton let her have a small Anchor

Monday 16th

Monday commenced with a light breeze from N.E.
by the winds to N.W. under double reefed top sails
thick fog & heavy rains 4 P.M. cooled down 5 o'clock
dropped the anchor in 30 fathoms water cleared up the
sails & the middle & later part of this day light
winds from N.W. with thick fog 10 o'clock
commenced boiling again

Tuesday 17th

Tuesday commenced with light winds from
the North West laying at anchor 9 A.M. the ice
came down was obliged to take the Anchor
middle part see all around the ship 3 o'clock
got out of the ice the middle & later part thick fog
4 o'clock finished boiling

Wednesday 18th

Wednesday commenced with light winds from
N.E. laying in ice the middle part baffling winds
from the South West 6 P.M. cleared off a little
saw the Land Round Island bearing N.N.W.

Thursday July 19th

Thursday commenced with a light breeze from the N.W. West
steering by the wind to the N.East under hole top sails the
fog ice all a round the ship the middle part trying to
get out of the ice later part of the day clear spells saw the
Land Round Island N.W. Fog do N.E. 20 mls. dist. 14 ships
in sight none boiling nor hauling.

Friday 20th

Friday commenced with a calm 2 A.M. had a light
breeze from N.East steering to S. West under all sail
4 A.M. wore ship to the east - wind winds N.East
the middle and later part thick fog spoke the ship
Montcal Capt. Gray 4 whales 1700. in all.

Saturday 21

Saturday commenced with a very light breeze from the
North East laying with the main yard to the mast
6 o'clock P.M. took in all sail & dropped the Anchor in
40 fathoms of water. Later part quite clear commenced steering
down in the main hatch Round Island bearing
N.N.W. Bird Is. S.E.

Sunday 22nd

Sunday commenced with light winds from S.W.
all hands stowing down spoke ship Joseph
Koyden 4 whales the middle & later part of this
day quite clear light winds from most every point in
the compass 10 o'clock took the Anchor & made sail

Monday 23rd

Monday commenced with a calm the middle and
later part light winds from the West clear waters
steering by the winds to the S West under all sail
11 P.M. Round Island bearing N.W. 5 mls dist
