

Tuesday July 24th 55.

Tuesday commenced with a light breeze from N.E. East heading to the West and under all sail 1 O'clock A.M. sat in thick fog lost ship to East and the middle part of day with rain. Later part quite clear Round Island bearing East 3 1/2 mls dist.

Wednesday 25th

Wednesday commenced with light winds from the North & East. by the winds upon the stern tack 2 1/2 O'clock A.M. saw two boats of the ship's company. the proved to be two boats belonging to the J. Swift which left for 48 hours previous & had lost their ship. A.M. dropt the anchor Round Island bearing N.E. by East 4 mls dist. the middle & later part foggy with Rain &c.

Thursday 26th

Thursday commenced with a light breeze from N.E. laying at anchor. the middle and later part of this day quite clear. Light winds from N.E. East 9 O'clock P.M. took the anchor. made sail stood to the North & West. were 12 O'clock dropt the anchor again in 21 fathoms water. Round Is. bearing E by North Large Shantar S.W. point S.W. by W 1/2 West 6 mls dist.

Friday 27th

Friday commenced with a light breeze from the North East laying to anchor the middle & later part of this day thick fog & calm lying at anchor with ship Antonio

Saturday 28th July

Saturday commenced with a calm. Middle & later part very light winds from the North West, all of this day foggy

Sunday 29th

Sunday commenced with a very light breeze from the N.E. at anchor thick fog the most of the time 6 O'clock A.M. took the anchor. made sail steering by the winds to East and 10 A.M. dropt the anchor again thick fog all of this day thick fog the most of the time

Monday 30th

Monday commenced with strong winds from N.E. 12 O'clock the ship commenced dragging his anchor. hove it up & found that stock had broke took it in got the other off & dropt it thick fog &c. the middle & later part thick fog with a light breeze from N.E.

Tuesday 31

Tuesday commenced with light breeze from the N.W. East laying to anchor 4 O'clock A.M. cleared off Round Island bearing N.E. Large Shantar Middle part thick fog 6 O'clock P.M. took the anchor made sail by the winds to S.E. Later part quite clear saw the Land &c.

Wednesday August 1.

Wednesday commenced with quite clear weather winds from N.E. by the winds to the east and 2 A.M. dropt the anchor in 40 fathoms of water. the middle & later part of this day thick fog shot ship Moelaguna & whales
