Thursday 13th September

Thursday commenced with strong breeze from N.W. steering E. by North 2. o'clock A.M. took the main top-gallant sail & double reefed the Top Sails 6 o'clock took in fore & mizen top-sails & close reefed the main, came by the wind under storm sail heaving upon the Northern tack. Middle part of the day blowing a heavy Gale. Last fore top mast stay sail & main-spencer gaff. Later part rather moderate bent a new fore top mast stay sail

Latitude 55-55 Long 151-37

Friday 14th

Friday commenced with a Moderate Gale from N.W. steering E. by North under close reefed main top sail & fore sail. 2 o'clock A.M. set the fore & mizen top-sails. Middle part quite moderate set fore & main sail & set out the reef. Later part of the day under all sail 8 o'clock Landed the boats for Right Whales no success

Latitude 55-56 Long 152-47 Saturday 15th

Saturday commenced with a light breeze from the N.W. by the wind Boats chasing Whales. 1 p.m. took in sail for the night 8 o'clock A.M. landed the Boats no success. The middle & later part of the day fine weather wind from N.W.

Latitude 55-56 Long 152-58 Sunday 16th

Sunday commenced with light winds from S.W. steering off S.E. 3 o'clock A.M. landed the Boats for Right Whales. The Boat struck part of the line & lost the whale, came on board took in sail for the night. The middle & later part of the day light winds from N.W. later part steering East no whales.

Monday commenced with light winds from W.S.W. steering East under all sail 2 o'clock came by the wind to the South and Spoke Ship Manning of New Bedford 1100 Bbls this season. middle part light winds later part strong winds from the N.E. with a light fog steering by the winds

Latitude 54-36 Long 153-04 Tuesday 18th

Tuesday commenced with strong breezes from the N.E. by the winds to S.E. under hole top sails & main top-gallant sail 3 a.m. took in main top-gallant sail 7 o'clock double reefed the top sail for the night. The middle & later part of the day strong winds from W.S.W. steering by the winds to the South and under all sail Spoke Ship Manure, Capt. Pease

Latitude 54-46 Long 153-07 Wednesday 19th

Wednesday commenced with strong winds under hole top-sails 2 o'clock double reefed the top sails 4 o'clock took in fore & mizen top-sails 6 o'clock close reefed the main top-sail. The middle part quite moderate. Later part under double reefed steering to the South and

Latitude 53-46 Long 151-52 Thursday 20th

Thursday commenced with strong winds from N.W. by the winds to the North under hole top sails. The middle part calm. Later part light breezes from N.E. steering S.S.W. today Bent a new main top-sails & fore sail Spoke Ship Onward Capt James Norton 300 Bbls

Latitude 54-35 Long 152-07 Friday 21st

Friday commenced with a strong breeze from the N.E. East by the winds to the South and 3 o'clock saw Right Whales landed 6 o'clock the Boat struck & parted the line, the middle & later part strong winds from E.S.E. by the winds
