Begins with light S.E. winds steering N.E. by N. the weather clear and pleasant. at 9 P.M. lowered for right whales but could not get near them. crew employed breaking out water. saw several humpbacks So. Ends.

Thursday May 8th

Lat 38-10-N
Long 135-06-E
This 24 hours begins with light easterly winds steering N.E. by N. the weather clear and pleasant middle and latter part of the day the wind S.W. accompanied with fog. crew employed in ships duty. So. Ends.

Friday May 9th 1856

Lat 39-00-N
Long 135-30-E
Commences with light breezes from the S.W. accompanied with fog steering N.E. by N. middle part of the day the wind N.E. heading N.N.W. at 10 P.M. spoke the bark Dartmouth crew employed in ships duty So. Ends.

Saturday May 10th

Long 135-30-E
Begins with fresh breezes from N.E. steering by the wind heading N. at 2 A.M. lowered for whales in company with several other ships boats but could not strike. middle and latter part of the day thick fog So. Ends.

Sunday May 11th

Lat 39-40-N
Long 135-34-E
This day begins with light breezes from the S.W. heading N.N.E. on one tack and N.S.W. on the other. at 7 A.M. spoke the George and Mary of N. London at 9 P.M. lowered the boats for right whales but could not strike. crew employed in various duties. saw 12 sail. So. Ends.

Monday May 12th

Lat 41-14-N
Long 136-47-E
Commences with fresh breezes from the S.W. steering N.E. by N. at 5 A.M. spoke the Marengo of N.B. clean. latter part of the day strong westerly winds accompanied with fog took in the light sails and doubled reefed the top sails crew employed in ships duty. saw 1 sail So. Ends.

Tuesday May 13th

Lat 42-45-N
Long 137-55-E
Begins with fresh westerly winds steering N.E. by N. at 2 A.M. moderate made all sail latter part of the day light variable winds heading to the northward. crew employed sending down the main spencer gaff to repair it. Spoke the Marengo. So. Ends.

Wednesday May 14th

Lat 43-01-N
Long 138-39-E
This day begins with light northerly wind steering by the wind heading E by N. at 3 A.M. spoke the Marengo. middle and latter part of the day calm. crew employed in various duties. So. Ends.

Thursday May 15th

Lat 44-46-N
Long 139-37-30-E
This 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from N.W. steering N.E. by N. the weather clear and pleasant. at 6 A.M. lowered in company with the Marengo's boats but could not strike. middle and latter part of the day strong S.W. winds. crew employed in ships duty So. Ends.

Friday May 16th

Lat 45-28-N
Long 140-44-E
Begins with fresh breezes from the S.W. steering N.N.E. carrying all sail. the weather thick and hazy. middle part of the day moderate latter part strong gales from N.N.E. hove to under double reefed main top sail and fore sail. heading N.W. crew employed in ships duty. So. Ends.
