Sunday May 25th
 This 24 hours begins with strong S E winds accompanied with snow steering N N E under double reefed top sails. at 7. a.m. hove to under double reefed main top sail and fore sail. middle part of the day calm latter part light westerly winds accompanied with snow made all sail steering by the wind heading N N W. crew employed in various duties
 So Ends.

Lat 54=30

Long 146=05

Monday May 26th

Begin with light westerly winds accompanied with thick fog steering by the wind heading N N W. at 6. p.m. double reefed the top sails. latter part of the day strong northerly winds accompanied with snow small steering by the wind heading N N W. crew employed in ships duty
 So Ends.

Lat 54=46

Long 144=55

Tuesday May 27th

Commences with light breezes from N N W steering by the wind heading W. at 7. a.m. wore ship heading N E. middle and latter part of the day light northerly winds heading N N W. crew employed in ships duty
 So Ends.

Lat 54=59

Long 144=20

Wednesday May 28th

Begin with light southerly winds accompanied with thick fog steering N N W. at 7. a.m. shortened sail and hauled on the wind latter part of the day steering W under all sail.
 So Ends.

Lat 54=59

Long 143=37

Thursday May 29th

Begin with light breeze from E S E steering W. at 3. a.m. raised the ice. at 4. tacked ship and stood off middle and latter part thick fog. crew employed in ships duty.
 So Ends.

Lat 55=38

Long 143=20

Friday May 30

This day begins with light breezes from E N E accompanied with thick fog standing in for the ice. at 1. a.m. spoke the bark Oscar 3 whale middle and latter part clear and calm.
 So Ends.

Lat 55=48

Long 142=20

Saturday May 31st

Commences with clear and calm weather at 1. a.m. lowered for bowheads at 7 spoke the Corinthian 1 whale middle and latter part of the day calm accompanied with thick fog. crew employed breaking out provisions and water.
 So Ends.

No Observation

Sunday June 1st

Begin with calm foggy weather lying with the head yards aback middle and latter part of the day light winds standing along the ice. saw several sail.
 No Observation

Monday June 2nd

Throughout this day light S W winds and thick fog standing off and on the ice. crew employed in ships duty. saw several sail.
 So Ends.

Tuesday June 3rd

Begin with light southerly winds and clear weather standing to the N E along the ice. latter part foggy crew employed in ships duty saw 15 sail.
 So Ends.
