Wednesday June 4th

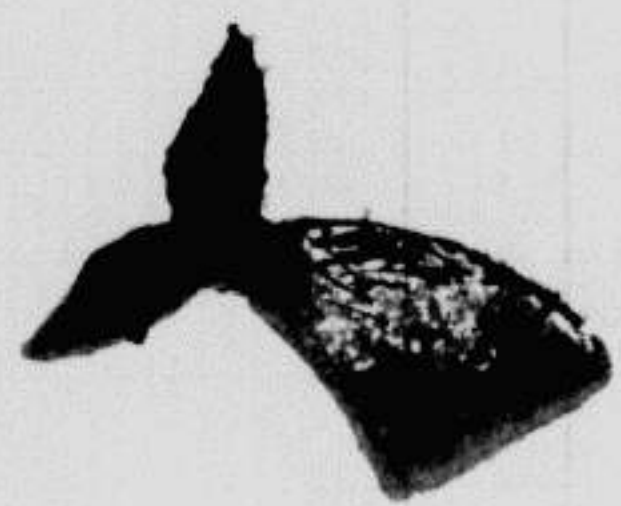
Lat 56=55.

Long 141=33.

Begins with light S W winds running along the ice heading N.E. at 1 A.M. spoke the Adeline Gibbs. 4 whale at 2 spoke the Navy and Omega middle and latter part of the day strong breezes standing to the westward through the ice at 10 P.M. raised the land to the northward of Cape Narki. bearing N.W. distance 30 miles crew employed in ships duty

So. Ends.

Thursday June 5th



Lat

56=55. N

Commences with strong S W winds working to the S W under double reefed top sails. at 1 A.M. lowered 4 boats and chased until we came to thick ice latter part of the day foggy crew employed in ships duty. So. Ends.

Friday June 6th

Lat

56=59=N

This day begins with strong breezes from S.W. working to the S.W. through the ice the weather foggy. latter part of the day clear saw 1 whale and 5 sail. So. Ends. Saw the land

Saturday June 7th

Lat 56=55

This 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the S.W. standing through the ice to the westward under double reefed top sails in company with the Ben Tucker and Omega. middle and latter part of the day calm lowered for whales but could not get near them saw the land and 5 sail. crew employed in ships duty. So. Ends.

Sunday June 8th

Lat

57=00=N

Begins with calm foggy weather lying with the main yard aback in the ice. middle part of the day clear latter part foggy crew employed in ships duty So. Ends.

Monday June 9th

No Observation

This day begins with light breezes from N.W. accompanied with fog at 1 A.M. spoke the Junior clean. the Capt. went on board and shipped Mr Dexter as third mate. latter part strong gales carrying close reefed top sails. So. Ends.

Tuesday June 10th

Lat

57=02.

Commences with strong N.E. gales accompanied with fog and rain carrying close reefed main top sail heading E.S.E. on one tack and N.W. on the other latter part of the day clear and moderate made all sail and stood in to the land. at 10 P.M. spoke the brig Targuena. crew employed breaking out provisions. saw the land and 4 sail So. Ends.

Wednesday June 11th

Lat

57=10=N

This 24 hours begins with light S.W. winds standing in for the land the weather clear and pleasant. at 6 P.M. sent the boats in shore to look for whales. saw several Calafornia greys and 4 sail. So. Ends.

Thursday June 12th

Lat

57=03.

Begins with light S.W. winds lying off and on the land. boats in shore at 4 A.M. bent the cables and got the anchor off the bows. latter part of the day standing to the southward. saw 13 sail.
