

Log Book Ship Chandler Rice

Thursday Aug 7th
Begins with light easterly winds
carrying all sail. Beating down the bay
to Feklistoff at 3. A.M. the boats
returned. saw 1 whale in the ice
at 8. P.M. anchored in Feklistoff harbor
the Capt went ashore to the wreck of
the brig Tarquena and bought 6 bbls
of provisions and 7 oars crew employed
in breaking out provisions and water.
13 sail lying at anchor So. Ends.

Friday Aug 8th
Commences with light variable winds
and pleasant weather. lying at anchor
in Feklistoff harbor. At 11. P.M. got
underway for Shanter bay. saw no whales
So Ends

Saturday Aug 9th
This 24 hours begins with light variable
winds and pleasant weather. carrying all
sail bound to Shanter bay. at 8. A.M.
anchored in the mouth of Shanter
bay. middle and latter part of the
day heavy squalls accompanied with fog
and rain. 4 boats off So Ends

Sunday Aug 10th
This day begins with fresh breezes
from the S.E. accompanied with fog
lying at anchor in the mouth of
Shanter bay. at 5. A.M. the ice came
down on the ship hove up the anchor
and run in nearer the land. four
boats off. crew employed in ships
duty. So. Ends.

Monday Aug 11th
Begins with light S.E. winds.
the weather clear and pleasant
lying at anchor on the west
side of Shanter bay. at 7. A.M.
the boats returned saw no whales
middle and latter part of the day
thick fog 5 boats off. So. Ends.

Tuesday Aug 12th
Commences with light S.E. winds
accompanied with fog lying at anchor
on the west side of Shanter bay. at 3 P.M.
5 boats left. the ship to look for
whales. latter part of the day clear and
calm. So. Ends.

Wednesday Aug 13th
This 24 hours begins with light
N.W. winds accompanied with rain
squalls. lying at anchor on the west
side of Shanter bay. at 6. A.M.
the boats returned saw a few whales
in the ice but could not get near
them. at 3. P.M. 4 boats left the
ship to look for whales. the weather
thick and foggy. So. Ends.

Thursday Aug 14th
Begins with light S.E. winds.
the weather hazy. lying at anchor
on the west side of Shanter bay. 4.
boats off. At 3. P.M. the larboard and
starboard boats struck and killed
two whales and commenced towing them
to the ship. middle and latter part
of the day thick fog and rain.
So. Ends.
