

Log Book Ship Chandler Price.

Saturday Aug 23rd
 Begins with strong N.E. winds accompanied with fog. Lying at anchor in Shaxter Bay. At 1 A.M. finished boiling. At 3 P.M. sent the starboard and waist-boats whaling and the remainder of the crew employed stowing down. So. Ends.

Sunday Aug 24th

Commences with fresh breezes from the N.E. accompanied with fog and rain at 2 A.M. the starboard boat returned and reported the waist-boat with a whale about 10 mile from the ship. At 1/2 past 2 A.M. got underway with the ship and stood in the direction of the whale as far as the wind and tide would permit. crew employed stowing down. So. Ends.

Monday Aug 25th

This day begins with light N.E. winds accompanied with fog. At 3 A.M. sent off 4 boats to tow the whale to the ship. At 9 A.M. brought the whale alongside and made him fast. At 4 P.M. commenced cutting. At 5 P.M. the bow boat lowered and struck a whale and anchored him at 11 P.M. finished cutting. sent 3 Boats off to tow the whale to the ship. crew employed whaling cutting in and stowing down. So. Ends.

Tuesday Aug 26th
 Begins with clear calm weather lying at anchor in Shaxter Bay. At 1 P.M. took the bow boat whale along side and commenced cutting. At 6 A.M. the larboard boat lowered and struck a whale and drewed. At 7 finished cutting and started the works. At 8 P.M. the larboard and bow boats lowered the bow boat struck and killed a whale and brought him to the ship. crew employed cutting boiling and stowing down and ~~stowing~~ So. Ends.

Wednesday Aug 27th
 This day begins with clear calm weather lying at anchor in Shaxter Bay. At 6 A.M. finished cutting middle and latter part of the day light rain squalls 3 boats off. the remainder of the crew employed boiling.

Thursday Aug 28th
 Commences with light-variable winds accompanied with rain. middle and latter part of the day clear and calm 4 boats off ship keeps employed boiling. So. Ends.

Friday Aug 29th
 Begins with clear calm weather lying at anchor in Shaxter Bay. At 12 A.M. the bow boat struck a whale and anchored him the rest of the boats went aboard and got the ship underway and run down to the whale. took him along side and let go the anchor. At 4 P.M. commenced cutting. latter part of the day clear and calm. So. Ends.
