

Log Book Ship Chandler Price

Crayton P Holcomb Master 1856.

Monday Sept 8th

Begins with clear calm weather lying at anchor in shanter bay at 4 A.M. put out the starboard boat latter part of the day light winds saw no whales crew employed stowing down So Ends

Tuesday Sept 9th

This day begins with light variable winds lying at anchor in shanter bay at 6 A.M. finished stowing down. 4 boats off. saw a few whales. So Ends

Wednesday Sept 10th

Commences with light easterly winds lying at anchor in shanter bay. at 3 P.M. lowered 4 boats for whales at 5 P.M. the larboard boat struck and killed a whale and brought him to the ship and cut him in. latter part of the day rainy So. Ends.

Thursday Sept 11th

Begins with calm rainy weather lying at anchor in shanter bay at 5 A.M. finished cutting and started the works. at P.M. sent three boats off saw a few whales So. Ends

Friday Sept 12th

This 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the eastward lying at anchor in shanter bay. middle and latter part of the day thick fog and rain. crew employed boiling So. Ends.

Saturday Sept 13th

Begins with light westerly winds lying at anchor in shanter bay at 2 A.M. sent down the fore and main royal and fore and mizzen top gallant yards at 6 A.M. commenced blowing from the westward furled all sails and shackled on the starboard chain latter part of the day light winds crew employed boiling saw 1 whale So. Ends

Sunday Sept 14th

Commences with light variable winds lying at anchor in shanter bay at 4 P.M. got underway for the west side of shanter bay at 11 P.M. finished boiling. So. Ends.

Monday Sept 15th

This day begins with strong westerly winds steering by the wind heading N.N.W. at 1 A.M. carried away the 1st. at 4 past 1. anchored about two miles from the west shore latter part of day calm employed stowing down. So. Ends.

Tuesday Sept 16th

Begins with light westerly winds and pleasant weather lying at anchor on the west side of shanter bay. at 4 P.M. got under way and stood in close to the land to get wood and water crew employed mending unbending and bending sails So. Ends.
