Wednesday Sept 17<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with light variable winds  
lying at anchor on the west side of  
Shanter bay. At 2 A.M. sent in  
a raft of casks for water. middle  
and latter part of the day rainy.  
employed getting off wood and water  
So. Ends.

Thursday Sept 18<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with fresh breezes from  
the S.E. lying at anchor on the west  
side of Shanter bay. middle and latter  
part of the day strong westerly winds. crew  
employed storing down water boating off  
wood and scraping bone. So. Ends.

Friday Sept 19<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with fresh westerly winds  
and pleasant weather. lying at anchor  
on the west side of Shanter bay. At  
4 P.M. got under way and stood out  
into the middle of the bay saw no  
whales. stood in again and let go the  
anchor latter part of the day strong  
N.E. winds. crew employed spreading  
out bone to dry. So. Ends.

Saturday Sept 20<sup>th</sup>

This 24 hours begins with strong  
N.E. winds lying at anchor on the  
west side of Shanter bay. middle and  
latter part of the day light winds  
accompanied with snow squalls So. Ends

Sunday Sept 21<sup>st</sup>  
Begins with light northerly winds lying  
at anchor on the west side of Shanter bay  
latter part of the day calm. crew  
employed reeving new braces and  
reeftackels. saw no whales  
So. Ends.

Monday Sept 22<sup>nd</sup>  
Throughout this day light winds and  
pleasant weather lying at anchor  
on the west side of Shanter bay.  
saw no whales. So. Ends.

Tuesday Sept 23<sup>rd</sup>  
Commences with light southerly  
winds. lying at anchor on the west  
side of Shanter bay. crew employed  
breaking out provisions. saw no  
whales.

Wednesday Sept 24<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with fresh breezes from the  
N.W. lying at anchor on the west side  
of Shanter bay. At 5 P.M. the wind  
increased to a gale. let go the starboard  
anchor. crew employed in ships duty  
So. Ends.

Thursday Sept 25<sup>th</sup>  
This day begins with strong gales from  
the N.E. accompanied with rain. lying  
with both anchors down on the west  
side of Shanter bay. crew employed  
breaking out water. So. Ends.

saw no whales

Friday Sept 26<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with strong N.E. winds lying  
at anchor on the west side of Shanter  
bay. at 4 P.M. got under way and stood  
to the S.E. the weather thick and rainy  
So. Ends.

Saturday Sept 27<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with light N.E. winds accompanied  
with rain. tack and tack. carrying all sail  
at 9 A.M. anchored in the middle of the bay  
latter part of the day strong breezes  
saw a few whales but did not lower  
So. Ends.
