Monday Oct 27th

 Begins with strong breezes from ESE accompanied with rain. by the wind to the NE. under double reefed top sails. at 3 a.m. furled the fore and mizzen top sails Jib and main sail. at 1/2 past 4 a.m. close reefed the main top sail. at 1/2 past 5 a.m. the wind hauled to the northward wore ship and furled the fore sail. middle and latter part of the day blowing heavy from NNE to NNW crew employed in ships duty. So. Ends.

Tuesday Oct 28th

 Commences with heavy gales from the NNW lying to under close reefed main top sail heading NNE. at 4 a.m. moderated put the ship on her course ESE. and set the fore sail. at 5 set the fore top sail close reefed. middle and latter part of the day quite moderate made all sail. steering E by S. crew employed in various duties. So. Ends.

Wednesday Oct 29th

 This day begins with light westerly winds carrying all sail. course E by S. at 3 a.m. the wind hauled to the southward and commenced blowing and raining took in the light sails. at 1/2 past 4 a.m. double reefed the top sails. at 6 took in the Jib and main sail. middle and latter part of the day moderate made all sail. crew employed at washing the lower masts the leak increasing. So. Ends.

Thursday Oct 30th

 Begins with fresh breezes from the southward by the wind heading ESE. at 3 a.m. the wind hauled to SSW and commenced blowing and raining took in the top gallant sails and flying Jib. at 4 a.m. double reefed the top sails. at 1/2 past 8 a.m. reefed the main sail middle and latter part of the day clear with fresh gales. crew employed in ships duty. So. Ends.

Friday Oct 31st

 This day begins with fresh gales from SSW under double reefed top sails and courses. the weather clear. course ESE. at 4 a.m. turned the reefs out of the main top sail and main sail. middle part of the day moderate made all sail. latter part wind SE heading ENE. crew employed at washing bone. So. Ends.

Saturday Nov 1st

 Commences with fresh breezes from the SE by the wind heading ENE. at 3 a.m. broke out the fore peak and found the leak on the starboard bow but could not stop it. middle and latter part the same crew employed washing bone. So. Ends.

Sunday Nov 2nd

 Begins with fresh SE winds by the wind heading NE by E. at 1 a.m. tacked ship heading S by W. middle and latter part the same. ship leaking about 600 strokes an hour. So. Ends.
