

# Log Book Ship Chandler Price. 1857

**Saturday Mar 28<sup>th</sup>**  
 Lat Commences with strong breezes from NW. W. accompanied with rain. course E. latter part of the day S.W. winds clear and pleasant  
 Long 81 = 05 = W. crew employed in ships duty So. Ends.

**Sunday Mar 29<sup>th</sup>**  
 No Observation Begins with light S.W. winds and pleasant weather. carrying all sail. course E. middle and latter part of the day calm saw 1 sail standing to the northward  
 So. Ends.

**Monday Mar 30<sup>th</sup>**  
 Lat 55 = 40 = S. This 24 hours begins with calm rainy weather. middle and latter part of the day light variable winds. saw 1 sail  
 Long 77 = 51 = W. day light variable winds. saw 1 sail So. Ends

**Tuesday Mar 31<sup>st</sup>**  
 Lat This day begins with calm pleasant weather. latter part of the day light  
 Long N.W. winds. course E. employed breaking out provisions So. Ends.

**Wednesday Apr 1<sup>st</sup>**  
 Lat Begins with light breezes from the NW. carrying all sail. course E. middle and latter part of the day fresh breezes  
 Long 73 = 20 = W. crew employed in ships duty. So. Ends

**Thursday Apr 2<sup>nd</sup>**  
 Lat This 24 hours begins with strong NW winds and thick weather course E. at 8 A.M. took in the studding sails and main royal. middle and latter part of the day strong gales. carrying double reefed top sails  
 Long 66 = 15 = W. So. Ends

# Crayton P Holcomb Master 1857.

**Friday Apr 3<sup>rd</sup>**  
 Lat Begins with strong westerly winds the weather hazy. during the morning watch made all sail. course NE by N. At 3 P.M. a young man by the name of Campbell died. after an illness of 2 mos latter part of the day the wind N.W. So. Ends.

**Saturday Apr 4<sup>th</sup>**  
 Lat Begins with fresh breezes from NW. by the wind to the NE. carrying all sail  
 Long At 4 A.M. called all hands and buried the corpse of Campbell after the usual ceremony middle and latter part of the day S.W. winds course N by E. employed washing paint work So. Ends

**Sunday Apr 5<sup>th</sup>**  
 Lat This 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the S.W. carrying all sail.  
 Long course N by E. latter part of the day westerly winds. the weather clear and pleasant So. Ends.

**Monday Apr 6<sup>th</sup>**  
 Lat Commences with fresh breezes from the westward steering N by E. At 3 A.M. hauled down the studding sails and braced up the yards heading N by W. middle and latter part of the day S.W. winds heading N.N.E. employed in ships duty. So. Ends

**Tuesday Apr 7<sup>th</sup>**  
 No. Observation Begins with fresh breezes from the NW. by the wind heading N.N.E. middle part of the day calm and rainy. latter part light southerly winds steering NW. crew employed breaking out water and washing paint work. saw 1 sail. So. Ends.
