

Log Book. Ship Chandler Price 1857.

Friday Apr 24th

Lat 24 = 09 = S. Begins with light variable winds and rain. middle and latter part of the day
Long 36 = 56 = W. light breezes from E N E. by the wind heading N. the weather clear and pleasant employed setting up the head stays. saw 2 sail. So. Ends.

Saturday Apr 25th

Lat 23 = 40 = S. This day begins with light breezes from E N E by the wind heading N. middle and latter part of the day wind N N W heading N E. the weather rainy. employed wetting hold. saw 1 sail. So. Ends.

Sunday Apr 26th

No Observation Commences with light breezes from N N W accompanied with rain squalls by the wind heading N E. latter part of the day light southerly winds. set lower. top mast and top gallant studding sails. course N E by N. saw 1 sail. So. Ends.

Monday Apr 27th

No Observation This 24 hours begins with light S E wind accompanied with rain. course N E by N. at 1. A. M. took in the lower studding sail latter part of the day light easterly winds by the wind heading N by E. spoke the George and Mary of New London saw 3 sail. So. Ends.

Tuesday Apr 28th

Lat 18 = 46 = S. Begins with light easterly winds accompanied with rain. by the wind heading N N E. at 1. A. M. exchanged signals with a large English Clipper standing to the southward. middle and latter part of the day clear and pleasant. employed repairing the rigging and making new top mast and top gallant studding sail booms. saw 1 sail. So. Ends.

Wednesday Apr 29th

Lat 17 = 25 = S. Begins with light easterly winds and pleasant weather carrying all sail. course N by E by E. middle and latter part of the day light variable winds. employed unbending. bending and mending sails saw 7 sail. So. Ends.

Thursday Apr 30th

No Observation This day begins with light breezes from N N E by the wind heading N W by N. middle and latter part of the day light variable winds accompanied with rain. employed washing paint work. saw 4 sail. So. Ends.

Friday May 1st

Lat 15 = 34 = S. Commences with light N N W winds accompanied with heavy rains. by the wind heading N N E. at 3. A. M. the wind hauled to S S W. squared in the yards and set lower. top mast and top gallant studding sails. at 5. A. M. exchanged signals with a Prussian Brig. middle and latter part of the day light variable winds. employed repairing the rigging and mending the flying jib. saw 4 sail. So. Ends.

Saturday May 2nd

Lat 14 = 05 = S. This 24 hours begins with light breezes from E N E. by the wind heading North at 5. A. M. exchanged signals with a Brazilian Ship. latter part of the day easterly winds by the wind heading N by E. crew employed taking down the rigging and wetting hold. saw 2 sail. So. Ends.
