Sunday May 3rd
 Lat 12=03=S.
 Long 34=41=W.
 Begins with light easterly winds and pleasant weather. by the wind heading N by E & E. latter part of the day heading NNE. crew employed reading. saw 2 sail. So Ends.

Monday May 4th
 Lat 9=51=S.
 Long 34=04=W.
 This day begins with fresh breezes from the eastward by the wind heading NNE. the weather clear and pleasant. latter part of the day the wind ESE course NNE by N. employed taring down the rigging. So Ends.

Tuesday May 5th
 Lat 6=48=S.
 Long 33=58=W.
 Commences with fresh breezes from the SE course NE by N & N. at 1. a.m. set the fore top mast studding sail. latter part of the day steering N. employed turning in the fore top mast back stays. saw 1 sail. So Ends.

Wednesday May 6th
 Lat 4=36=S.
 Long 35=06=30=W.
 This 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the SE course NW by W. carrying lower. top mast and top gallant studding sails. middle part of the day calm and rainy. latter part fresh breezes from the SW course NWN. shifted over the studding sails. employed mending the flying jib. So Ends.

Thursday May 7th
 Lat 2=17=S.
 Long 37=23=W.
 Begins with fresh breezes from the SE course NW by N & N. carrying lower top mast and top gallant studding sails. latter part of the day wind SE. steering NWN. all hands employed turning in the fore rigging. So Ends.

Crayton P Holcomb Master 1857.

Friday May 8th
 Lat 00=00=
 Long 39=18=W.
 Begins with slight breezes from ESE. carrying all sail. course N by W & W. middle and latter part of the day heavy rain squalls. So Ends.

Saturday May 9th
 Lat 1=10=N.
 Long 39=30=W.
 This 24 hours begins with light variable winds accompanied with rain took in the studding sails and royals. middle and latter part ENE winds accompanied with heavy rain squalls. course NWN carrying top mast and top gallant studding sails employed wetting hold. So Ends.

Sunday May 10th
 Lat 2=57=N.
 Long 40=44=W.
 Commences with light NE winds accompanied with rain carrying top mast and top gallant studding sails. course NWN by N. middle and latter part of the day clear. So Ends.

Monday May 11th
 Lat 4=45=N.
 Long 42=40=W.
 This day begins with fresh breezes from the NE. course NW by N. the weather pleasant employed rattring down the fore rigging mending and bending the flying jib and breaking out flour and molasses. saw 1 sail. So Ends.

Tuesday May 12th
 Lat 6=55=N.
 Long 45=01=W.
 Begins with fresh breezes from the NE. course NW by N. the weather clear and pleasant. at 9. P.M. took in the main royal and fore top gallant studding sail. employed at various duties. saw 1 sail. So Ends.
