Sunday May 24th
Begins with fresh breezes from the westward accompanied with rain squalls. by the wind heading N.N.W. At 2 A.M. spoke the schooner Albert Dexter 10 days from New York. At 4. spoke the Bark Eliza Barfo of Bermuda. middle and latter part of the day northerly winds and pleasant weather heading W.N.W. saw 4 sail. Fourth mate growing worse So Ends.

Monday May 25th
This 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the northward by the wind heading W.N.W. the weather clear and pleasant. At 5 A.M. spoke the Bark Pocahontas of Holmes Hole. Butler Master middle part of the day wind N.N.E. heading N.W. latter part easterly winds steering N.N.W. employed in ship duty saw 5 sail So Ends.

Tuesday May 26th
Commences with light easterly winds and pleasant weather. carrying all sail course N by W. middle and latter part of the day light southerly winds steering N by W. employed in ships duty saw 8 sail. So Ends.

Wednesday May 27th
Begins with light southerly winds and pleasant weather carrying all sail. course N by W. middle and latter part of the day fresh breezes employed in various duties saw 8 sail. So Ends.

Thursday May 28th
This 24 hours begins with strong breezes from the southward carrying all sail course N.N.W. at 6 A.M. took in the studding sails and fore and mizzen royals. latter part of the day light winds and rain made all sail. employed tearing down the try works and stowing away the boat gear saw several sail. So Ends.

Friday May 29th
Commences with light southerly wind and hazy weather. carrying all sail. course N by E. middle and latter part of the day thick fog and rain saw 4 sail So Ends.

Saturday May 30th
Begins with light southerly winds and fog. course N by E. at 2 A.M. the fog lit up. raised Montauk Point bearing N.N.E. at 5 P.M. took a pilot. latter part of the day westerly winds steering E.N.E. employed bending the cables and getting the anchors off the bows. So Ends.

Sunday May 31st
This 24 hours begins with light westerly winds and pleasant weather carrying all sail. course N.E. by E. Block Island bearing W.N.W. distance 25 miles. at 2 A.M. anchored in New Bedford harbor and furled the sails. So Ends.
