

For dyspepsia

Pour one quart of cold water on two tablespoonfuls of unslaked lime let stand a few minutes, bottle and cork, and when clear it is ready for use put three tablespoonfuls in a cup of milk and drink any time, usually before meals

Furniture Polish

take equal parts of shellac varnish, linseed oil and spirits of wine

For cough in fowls

Douglas Mixture

is an excellent remedy and preventive, it is made as follows: One pound copperas, one gill sulphuric acid and two gallons water. Mix and shake thoroughly. Add one teaspoonful of the mixture to one quart of drinking water for both sick and healthy portions of the flock, though if the disease is very severe, double the amount may be given to the sick ones.

Cure for Corns

One teaspoonful of tar, one of Coars brown sugar and one of saltpetre, the whole to be warmed together, spread on a piece of kid to cover the corn, and in two days they will come out *Gr. H.*

Cure for Neuralgia

Half a drachm of sal ammonia in one ounce of camphor water, to be taken a teaspoonful at a dose, and the dose repeated several times at intervals of 5 minutes if the pain be not immediately stopped.
