

Remarks on board Bark Chandler Price. G.S.B.

Saturday Feb 21st 1862

anchored on the bar, I had things as
different here than they are on board a
sloop, every time we tack ship, a crew of
about all hands is called out to trim the
gear time a watch (see lines and etc.)

Sunday Feb 22nd 1862

This day commenced with a fresh breeze
from the S.E. at 10 AM I sailed on heading
down the Bar. at 2 PM
discharged the ship at 4 PM. at 5 PM the
Port anchor on the bar, middle part
material for the light, at 6 PM we
up some bar, (see lines and etc.)
will, (see lines and etc.) in observation to do

Monday Feb 23rd 1862

This day commenced with a light
breeze from the S.E. Park heading about
S.W. on the Port tack, at 6 PM rang
and continued so during the night at
2 PM fresh breeze from the S.E. I
S.E. at 10 PM I had the ship heading to
S.E. about 4 PM took in the galantails and
I had the ship at 6 PM all hands and ship
the cables on the weather quarter aft, latter
part fresh.

Tuesday Feb 24th 1862

This day commenced with a strong breeze
from the S.E. Park under what (see lines and etc.)
during the wind heading about S.E.
at 4 PM set the main galantails
at 12 PM a sail on the other tack, at
4 PM parted the main galantails by hook
- and it together and set the sail

from Maine M.D. to Glasgow. Feb 2nd 1862

Tuesday Feb 22nd 1862

at 10 AM took it in, employed in copying
sheet, latter part strong breeze from
E.N.E. Note. We pump the Park every
two hours, I should think not to exceed
ten minutes at a time, We all got
along nicely together, We have a good
even lot of in number, I shall soon
commence to write a private log, and
I enjoy a piece of mind to a considerable
degree.

Wednesday Feb 23rd 1862

This day commenced with a fresh breeze
from about E.N.E. Park on the Port
tack under top and courses, (see lines and etc.)
this afternoon I dreamed of Home and
the distant shore, and of seeing my family
middle part strong breeze from the
Eastward heading about S.E. at 4 PM took
the Starboard anchor in on deck, and in the
log and sails at 10 PM took them in, at 11
singled reefed the topsails, employed the
latter part stowing the starboard cable
below, forward of the Mizen mast.

Thursday Feb 24th 1862

This twenty four hours commenced with
fresh breeze from the S.E. Park on the Port
tack heading about S.E. I employed during
noon the chain the fore part, Park under
single reef topsails, one sail in sight at noon
moderate breeze turned the ship out of the
topsails, at 2 PM at the light sails latter
part moderate, at 2 PM was ship heading
the remainder of the day from, Latitude N
N.E. to E Longitude W.
