

Remarks on board Ship Gov Troop Capt Ashby

Tuesday April 21st / 63

this day commenced raining, employed getting coals ashore, all day so the Ship Brunswick wind her with 40 barrels of Stewin having seen what she did since leaving home

Wednesday April 22nd / 63

commenced raining, then a shower and then rain again, and then a lull and then rain rain rain. During the fore part carried 6 pipes of water, and stored it all again, at 6 PM I brought of a raft of water and took it on board

Thursday April 23rd / 63

this day raining as usual, employed to get getting the raft of water and storing her down. We have two some Kanakas to fill it and bring it through the reef for us. Although there has been no danger in going through there since we have been lying here, but when the tide flows down there is a heavy breaker across the River, on the 22 we sent the Carpenter down to Mahoe to go in the Hospital, he was a very sick man and raised blood all the time. In day the Starboard watch went on liberty

Friday April 24th / 63

this day commenced with a fine breeze on shore, employed during the fore morning storing down water, the Starboard watch on shore, liberty, the watch on board, employed in ship duty, at 6 AM the Cooks gally ashore

Saturday April 25th / 63

this day commenced with a strong sea breeze, employed during of the A after hole and between decks, the Starboard watch ashore on liberty after dinner, at 4 PM we were all ready for sea, but it being not fine we did not get underway

Civil time Sunday April 26th / 63

commenced raining, at 10 AM the Starboard watch went on liberty, at day I attended church, this day I shall make it last 12 hours long. Civil time

Nautical time Monday April 27

commenced light, the Starboard watch ashore on liberty at 7 PM four Kanakas came on board which had ship to go in the ship, and shortly after a boat went under way about 9 the air being very light, all hands on deck until 3 AM, when the Starboard watch went below, and slept until 4 AM, and then the starboard watch went below. In the fore part light trunks skirting to the N.E. with studding sail set at 4 PM all the watch came on board

Tuesday April 28th / 63

commenced no light, all sail set, strong breeze at 11 AM, now in sight at 7 PM sea calm, latter part fresh breeze

Wednesday April 29th / 63

commenced fresh, from the N.E. evening along the board of house, at 4 AM strong breeze at 6 AM, at 11 AM the Starboard watch went on shore to get the Captain's about 10 the boat came of shore bringing the letters and papers. I received 6 letters and the packages of papers, and sent 9 letters right to the station, latter part strong breeze

Thursday April 30th / 63

commenced strong, the under reef up, at 2 the boat came from the shore with a man, going which took passage up to the Oahu with us at 6 the Captain came and a Mr Cranston made all sail and stood to see strong W. S. middle and latter part much like the fore part
