

Remarks on board Ship Gov. Group Capt. Ashby. From N. E. Gulf

Sunday July 19th/63

commenced light steering in p. Breaker Island at 5.15
 kept the fore equalized. middle part light latter part
 light. 7.45 the S. & Crow boat went up the N. E. arm
 of the Bay but saw nothing during the
 latter part - the Ship came in the bay

Monday July 20th/63

these four hours commenced with a strong breeze
 from the S. W. & Ship of Negro boat
 two boats of at 6.15 came on board having seen
 no whale during the middle part stood over
 toward the Port at 5.15 light air from the
 Eastward steering N. by E. latter part strong breeze
 all the higher sails in. Bow head Island bearing
 to the S. Eastward of us

Tuesday July 21st/63

commenced moderate & clear. steering N. by E. on
 at 11.15 strong breeze from the Southward doubt
 if it latter at 3.15 made sail. middle and latter
 part light breeze. employed the latter part repairing
 the fore sails and bent it again

Wednesday July 22nd/63

commenced light and foggy. heading to the Southward
 all sail set. middle and latter part much
 much like the fore part

Thursday July 23rd/63

commenced with a light breeze from the
 S. W. all sail set heading to the S. E.
 middle and latter part heading to the S. W.
 latter part much like the fore part

Friday July 24th/63

commenced moderate heading to the S. W. all sail set
 breeze from the Westward at 5.15 steering N. by E. middle and latter part
 a light breeze from the North. thick fog

S. W. Bay (Vehotok Sea) North Shore July 25th Striped Bluff

Saturday July 25th/63

these four hours commenced with a moderate
 breeze and thick fog from the Northward
 steering N. by E. at 11.15 light air from the S. W.
 latter part moderate and no fog

Sunday July 26th/63

commenced light steering of the wind all sail
 set heading to the N. E. wind from the S. W.
 at 11.15 lashed ship and headed to the Southward
 middle and latter part much like the fore
 part

Monday July 27th/63

commenced light middle and latter part the same
 back our water

Tuesday July 28th/63

commenced with a light breeze at 1.15 raised the
 land at 2 came up to the Island of P. K. if
 saw big Shanks at 11 strong breeze steering N. by E.
 at 1.15 light breeze from the Westward at 3.15 raised
 a sail at 10 lowered the wind boat and went on
 board of the Ship. At 11
 saved her better on board these sails in sight besides
 the M. W. Robert Townsend (English) ^{69. 6. 1863} ~~1863~~
 at 12.15 made the North shore

Wednesday July 29th/63

commenced with all sail set heading to the windward
 gaining with the M. W. at 5.15 raised
 the middle and latter part light

Thursday July 30th/63

commenced light steering the North shore up
 at 3.15 P. M. came to anchor of Striped Bluff
 there being two ships there at anchor. Three Brothers
 of Pantheke one whale at 5.15 the boat went
 of two men up to the boat of the S. South
 Note that this day I shall make 36 hours
 long, so as to make it convenient as I am
 gone so much from the ship
