

Remarks on board Ship Geo. Tickel & Co. of New York

Wednesday December 23rd 1868

commenced with a moderate breeze and continued so through the day, frequent squalls of rain. latter part much like the fore part

Thursday December 24th 1868

commenced light from the S.E. leading to the N.E. - Weather calm ship and sea to the Eastward. middle part moderate with fair weather

Friday December 25th 1868

commenced with a good breeze from the S.E. at sail at morning & the wind backing about E. middle and latter part with breeze

continued in (S.E.) Ship up Latitude 11 Longitude 17

Saturday December 26th 1868

these twenty four hours commenced with fair from the N.E. driving to the wind at sail heading about E. by N. compass. middle part strong latter part much like the fore part

Sunday December 27th 1868

commenced moderate driving to the wind. heading about E. by S. on the P. and S. on the other. middle and latter part much like the fore part

Monday December 28th 1868

these twenty four hours commenced moderate from the S.E. all sail set steering by the wind. middle and latter part much like the fore part working to the S.E.

from Wahee I. to the coast of California

Tuesday December 29th 1868

these twenty four hours commenced with a moderate breeze from the N.E. leading to the E. all sail set. middle steering. latter part S.E. by E. middle part fresh latter part strong from the N.W.

Wednesday December 30th 1868

commenced strong from the N.W. ship under main & auxiliary steering

#1 & 2 E. by E. about 6 A.M. and land (the coast of California) latter part moderate with a fair easterly breeze during the latter part

Thursday December 31st 1868

commenced with a fair breeze from the about S.E. all sail set. at 2 A.M. took in the light sails excepting the main & auxiliary. latter part light wind about E. all sail set steering by the wind heading about S.E.

I wish for a happy new year, and I am going to be and so if I cannot have a happy new year by the help of my maker one year ago to day I quit chewing Tobacco for a short time and have not used for three chew since and it was when I had the teeth ache. My mind is kept happy, calm and tranquil. I will try to live more by faith this year than I did the last year. His love I feel quite resigned and happy. I will try to be more faithful that I may have his love. I will pretend at all time and that I may have the evidence that I have been accepted of him. I see his mercies upon my hands.
