

Mar. 20. Day of Henry 164

Saturday 27th Billed him or Sunday 28th August
at 10 AM. He came up and made out sail
starting with the S.E. in company with the
E. Cupphatis. Being down to Cape Saint
James, middle ^{and north} part respectively.

Monday Feb. 29th 1864.
 commenced light rain and ^{wind} continued
 so through the day. at 3 PM. hired a
 boat and went along side of the
 Shamrock Criger. From San Francisco
 bound to La Paz. In boat some
 other to her, and we obtained some
 Cal. California species, and found
 them. The *Stalania* was in the
 Pacific water, and latter
 part much like the *gale* last
 but quite small to be occasion
 by a cold.

Tuesday March 1st -
commenced with light ice and
and at 4:30 light breeze & cuts

Wednesday March 9th 1861
 commenced with a light air. at 4
 came to anchor off Cape St. ^{John} I was in the
 2nd station & water.

Thursday March 3rd 1894
sun and wind light. enlarged the gunnery
getting of recruits. seven boats at work
about shore. one ballcock a red orange a green
small boats. during the afternoon a
number of Mexican women came on board
during the night - two were escorted from
a John Wain & William Lacey. at about
9 AM went to sea with a good breeze starting
I under easy sail a fine clear breeze in
hour Latitude 21° 20' North

Latitude 21st 20. North
Longitude 109th 59 West

off the Pacific Ocean from the Bay to the S. Island
Friday March 4th / 64

commenced moderate stirring to the South
at 10.45. made loud middle and little part
much like the fore part Spat 12.24 P.
Song 11.01.42. W

Saturday March 5th 1864
commenced fish about 2 PM toward the L. &
Harris boat. The W. back a Greenback
baited from the crew and sunk the bait
at daylight light-broke our water at about
7.30 AM toward the L. & Bon boat as in the
Harris boat. The whale rather shy at noon
came aboard. Right large from the L. & B
Sat 19th 10 AM. L. & B. 11 AM 9th W

Sunday March 10th 49
commenced life-storing to the southward
for another island at 8 AM left the
wind standing of shore at daylight ran the
land along at 2:30 PM. Dropped the lead
boat. the wind very strong came along with
about 11 AM latter part wind from the Village

Latitude 18.35 N
Longitude 110.48 W

Monday March 4th/64
commenced with very unsettled winds
at 10 AM raised a sail, at 4 PM gained
with the ship. Observed 41 whals 1300 eight
or nine miles from shore, with and
rather fast and pleasant breeze from shore
at 11 AM starting N. by E. Sailed at 11 AM 12 AM

Tuesday March 24/64
commenced with a fresh breeze from about
N.W. all sail set steering N.P.E. captured
the fore part flaming the foremast standing
sail boom, middle and latter part

Lat - $17^{\circ} 3' 6''$ N.
Long. $114^{\circ} 3' 2''$ W.
