

at anchor of Toaki 7 sailed from Toaki 6

Monday April 4th/64

to day pleasant all day the Boat watch at
on liberty

Tuesday April 5th/64

commenced pleasant the Starboard watch on board
having liberty at 9 AM all on board the ready gun
sea waiting for a wind. Shift 6 Kanakas here at 2 PM
called all hands here up and went to sea good breeze
the latter part of the day. this day is fine morning
night 12 to 14 degrees above

Wednesday April 6th Sea time

at 2 AM called all hands here up and went to
sea latter part fresh. this day is for 12 hours

Thursday April 7th/64

commenced light raining from Toaki for Toaki
middle and latter part light air at 7 AM spoke
the Bark Martha 2nd Capt. J. A. King when
Toaker sick. she having sight of the island here
and after 120 fathoms about 12 came to anchor
of Toaki

Friday April 8th/64

commenced pleasant and continued so till
the day at 9 AM sent down the fore topmast
and replaced it at 11 AM it again the
Hog & the masts were gunning and killed
nearly 30 Wild Pigeons.

Saturday April 9th

pleasant nothing worth of notice to day the
Toaker sick & the line is outside

Sunday April 10th

commenced with calm at 4 PM got on
Toaker about side 60 fathoms. about 7 PM
commenced to blow & went to sea the
Ship Toaker left the same time. during the
middle part wind was variable with lots
of rain accompanied with lightning & the
latter part light

Monday April 11th/64

commenced light the main shuddersail set wind
about 1 PM at 2 PM wind about Toaker middle
and latter part light at daylight raised Toaker
steering middle part about N.W.W

Tuesday April 12th/64

commenced light wind from the Eastward middle
and latter part very calm at 8 PM the starboard
boat went on shore

Wednesday April 13th/64

commenced with a calm at 1 PM toward the Main-9
Boat boat and towed about two hours. the current
current setting to the eastward the ship was becalmed
of Simon Head and in the course of 6 hours went
most of up to Coacoa Head at 9 PM moderate
breeze worked toward Simon Head. at 6 PM boat
came of and brought of two letters to me one from
to T. the other from B. B. & D. B. small and
latter part moderate.

Thursday April 14th

commenced with a fresh breeze from Eastward. at
6 PM the Captain came on board made all sail
steering at 8 PM stowed the chains down.
Ship to Toaker which makes twenty three
men forward four Toaker carpenter's storage for
four Officers Toward & Cook middle and latter
part fresh at 4 PM the starboard boat
when at 4 PM got three hogs and two
barrels of wood

Friday April 15th

commenced with strong winds going of
9 AM at 11 AM at 7 PM. kept the ship
of and run down to the other town and
light. middle part strong latter part
moderate

of 9 on to and the north
